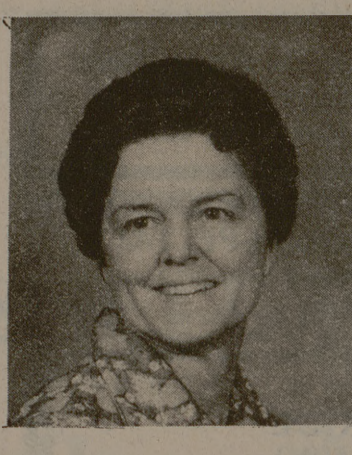

**Aggie rifle club sponsors rifle tourney**

The seventh annual Interstate Rifle Match was held March 24-25 at Texas A&M University. The match took place at the rifle range in the basement of the Military Science Building. There were 18 high schools and five junior rifle clubs from Texas and Louisiana involved in the tournament. The Texas A&M rifle club was the sponsor. Rifles were provided by the club. The high schools and rifle clubs were broken down into 36 teams. The teams consisted of all male or female teams and mixed teams. There were three categories that teams and individuals could participate in; ROTC, club and women's categories. Prone, kneeling and standing were the three judging events that all individuals participated in. A person had to shoot in each of these rifle positions. For each of the positions, a person was allowed two shots.

Each shot was worth one point, a total of six points. The number of points a team accumulated for each event was the overall team score. The overall team winner was Thomas High School from San Antonio with 2,111 points. The overall individual winner was Tommy Smith, Richland High School with 547 points. Ball High School scored first in the women's category with 1,967 points and Barbara placed first in the individual category with 547 points. Sabine Junior Rifle Club placed in the club awards with a score of 2,094. Jesse Best supervised the match. He said there were 18 high schools and five junior rifle clubs from Texas and Louisiana involved in the tournament since each participant had to watch and be a member of the club.
