## Friends plan tour

Mr. and Mrs. Carl Detering, restorers of the historically significant plantation, will open it for the meeting.

Friends president Mrs. M. F. "Chan" Driscoll said the meeting will include time to tour the house and grounds. A charter air conditioned bus will be available to Friends members at \$7 per person.

Liendo is famous as the former home of Elisabet Ney, well-known Texas sculptor. During the Civil War, the plantation was the site of Camp Groce. In 1865, it was a camping place for Gen. George Armstrong Custer's command.

The Friends meeting will feature an address by Dr. Frank E. Vandiver, Rice University vice president and provost, on the writing and illustrating of books. Book collector Jeff Dykes, Friends vice president-elect, will briefly discuss his occupation.

## Texas A&M gets \$16,000 in grants

Aluminum Company of America (ALCOA) recently presented \$5,000 to Texas A&M University's Aerospace Engineering Department.

The grant was presented by Lyle W. Hovland, ALCOA laboratories senior engineer and W.D. Essary, Rockdale plant engineering manager.

"This is a first year award and can be renewed for up to two years," Hovland told Vice President for Engineering Fred Benson and other department officials. It is one of 40 nationwide grants.

Texas Eastman Co. of Longview has awarded Texas A&M University's Chemical Engineering Department

a \$6,000 Eastman Kodak Fellowship.

Dr. Charles D. Holland, department head, said the fellowship will support one graduate student during the 1978-79 academic year.

Quaker Oats Foundation has awarded \$5,000 to the Texas A&M University College of Veterinary Medicine for radiology research, said Dean George C. Shelton.

The money is a memorial to the late Dr. W.C. Banks, head of veterinary radiology and professor of veterinary medicine and surgery. Banks originated "Radiographic Aids," a publication distributed by Quaker Oats to aid doctors in radiology diagnosis.

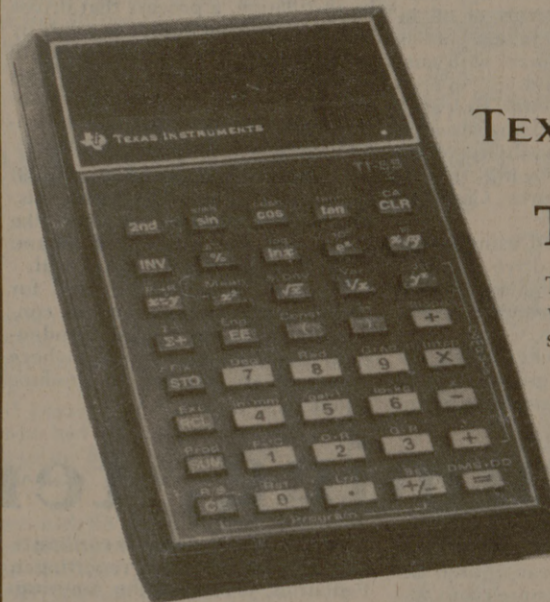
