Airline picks six women as new pilots

HOUSTON — Jill R. Brown is the first black woman to qualify as a pilot for a major U.S. airline. She received her flight wings from Texas International Airlines Wednesday in Houston.

Brown, 27, a native of Baltimore, was previously a pilot for a North Carolina commuter airline based in Raleigh. She joined five other women first officers becoming co-pilots on TI's DC9 passenger plane.

The addition of the six women increased the ranks of female flight crew members on major U.S. airlines by 20 percent, the airline said.

After ceremonies in the TI hangar at Hobby Airport near downtown Houston, Marcelyn Rae Bishop, of Oroville, Calif., became the woman co-pilot to make a scheduled passenger flight for TI to Houston-Dallas run.

Feminist Liz Carpenter and Anna Fisher, one of the new astronaut candidates, praised the selection of the women pilots, calling it another example of "women on the move," a slogan of the National Women's Conference held last year in Houston.

"It's a terrific day for women everywhere," Carpenter said. "I'm not entering a man's world but only a new and exciting world for a woman." She said, "I have felt a woman could accomplish anything with desire and hard work."

"I don't feel I compete with men, work with them," she said. "The doors are definitely open to women, the desire is there. I look forward to the day when women in aviation are the space program are the rule, not the exception."

The other women first officers were Duana Madrid Bucklin, 22, of Jamestown, R.I.; Linda Lou Grier, 23, of Miami; Mary Rose Susan Grier, 22, of Ellysburg, Pa.; and Bernita Lee Parkinson, 33, of Houston, Texas.

Parkinson, who has been a flight attendant for 10 years, is the first known female flight attendant to qualify as a pilot for a major airline.

All of the women were accomplished pilots before joining TI. All of the women received their pilot's licenses when they were either 17 — the youngest age possible — or 18.

All of the women's fathers are pilots.

For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Spring '78 Semester
To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:
1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Heaton Building, prior to Spring Break if possible, or at least one week in advance of ordering. This may not be done by phone.
2. Bring Mid-Semester Grade Report along when ready to order to verify passing hours.
3. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their Mid-Semester Grade Report along when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
4. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring Loans are available through Student Financial Aid in the YMCA Building.
5. Mid-Semester orders will be taken only from March 22nd until April 28th, 1978.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted. (Whenever 92 hours have been completed and are on record, there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send orders to the factory).
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on March 22nd or April 28th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately June 29, 1978.
