Woodard, contained for most of the game, gained 55 yards on 13 carries while halfback Brothers scored two touchdowns on a 1-yard burst.

"George was hitting the line extremely quick tonight," said Brothers. "I'd fake to him and the end crashing in allowing us to go down the field. We sure looked good for the workout together."

But the Maroon squad looked sharp as the Whites in their cause. David Beal, quarterback of the Maroons, was 4 for 10 passing 48 yards and one touchdown added 29 yards rushing.

The big-gain man for the Maroons was previously unknown to the Belcher. Belcher gained 107 yards on 16 carries in the game with one touchdown. Maroon halfback Armstrong added 98 yards on 16 carries while Curtis Dickey had 67 yards on 16 carries.

But the difference in the game was the foot of Tony Franklin. He was the foot of Tony Franklin in the game with five touchdowns left in the game to give the Whites a 27-24 victory.

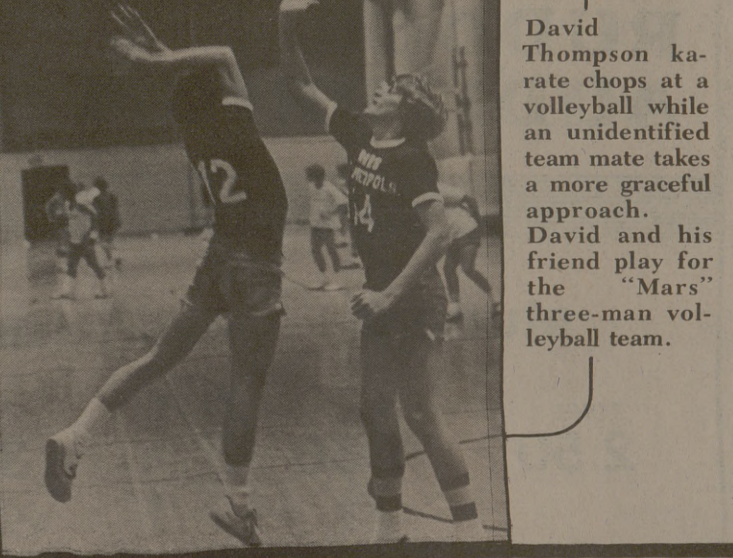
