### 35 animals adopted at third pet day

By KAYCE GLASSE Twenty-six dogs and nine cats were adopted Saturday at the third annual Pet Adoption Day held in Hensel Park.


The animals were strays and pets whose owners cold no longer keep them. Fifteen that were not adopted will be sent to the Houston Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals to be adopted or put to

The adoption fees were \$20 for dogs and \$16 for cats. The fees paid for worming and distemper medication, and spaying and neutering.

Jean Duffy, president of the Humane Society of Brazos County, said the remaining pets were not adopted because of their ages. Most people want the puppies and kittens, she said, even though the older dogs are often already house-trained and used to children.

One woman brought in a cat which was giving birth. The cat had been left with her and she thought Pet Adoption Day would help. Duffy said they will probably have to be sent to Houston, since it is unprobable that anyone would want to adopt four cats.

Some dogs and cats left one home, only to be picked up by a sympathetic person, then brought to Pet Adoption Day where they were adopted by yet another person or family
