When was the last time you heard of an all-American not being drafted by a National Football League m? It looks like it will become a ommon-day occurence in the fu-ire. Under the new agreement igned by the Players Association and the team owners last year the college draft has been reduced from rounds to the 12 rounds used this ar. That marks a decrease of 140 layers that were deleted from this ear's draft of college talent.

Among those players forgotten in he first annual shortened draft were ll-Americans Ken Smith and Zac enderson. Smith, a quarterback out of Boston College, completed 58 percent of his passes last season and ranked third in the NCAA with an average of 16.6 completions per game his senior year. Henderson, a defensive back out

of the University of Oklahoma, was verlooked by the 28 professional teams as was John Pagliaro, a Yale running back who was fifth in the ation in rushing in 1977.

This year's draft made history, not only for having the fewest number of players drafted but being the quickest draft on record. This year's draft was completed in a total of 17 hours and 16 minutes, the shortest aft ever by more than two hours. What team do you think led all he other schools in the number of players drafted this year? Not Notre Dame, who was the early leader with four players chosen in the first

Southern Cal or Ohio State.

Florida was the leader with 10 number of teams asking the clubs players selected in the 12 rounds. not to draft him.

Two other Southwest Conference players were drafted and will re-main close to home. The University of Houston's running back Alois Blackwell was drafted by the Dallas Cowboys in the fourth round Tuesday while Mike Renfro, TCU's record-breaking wide-receiver, was drafted by the Houston Oilers.






