



Two-headed calf might beat odds, live normal life

What would you do if you were the proud owners of a two-headed calf?

If you're Michael and Charlie Janak of Rockdale, you bottle feed him and see that he gets careful, loving attention from Texas A&M University's College of Veterinary Medicine.

Freddy, the two-headed, 8-week-old, Hereford-Charolais crossbred calf, was brought to Texas A&M's Large Animal Clinic for a checkup.

Senior veterinary medicine students, along with Dr. Dave Morris, instructor of large animal medicine and surgery, gave the white-faced patient a "fairly normal" bill of health.

"One of the unusual things about this calf is that it's still alive," Morris said. "Most animals with abnormalities like this don't live very long."

"I'd give the calf a one-out-of-four chance of surviving the next six months," he continued. "If he makes it past that time, chances are he'll live a fairly normal life."

Russia says China is pushing for war

MOSCOW — The Soviet Union accused China Tuesday of pushing for a world war, preparing itself by stockpiling weapons and strengthening its army.

The Communist Party newspaper Pravda said China opposes detente and does little to hide what Pravda called "hegemonic designs" over neighboring states.

Pravda has accused China of preparing for war before, but Tuesday's article, prominently displayed, was more severe in its criticism than earlier stories.

"Peking not only proceeds from the inevitability of a new world war, but is prodding it on, stepping up the material preparations for war," Pravda said.

"China is rapidly increasing her stockpiles of all types of weapons, including missile-nuclear armament, and is searching for new types of weapons in the West."

"While arming itself, China comes out for the strengthening of NATO and other imperialist military blocs, for the perpetuation and expansion of U.S. military presence in Europe and Asia."

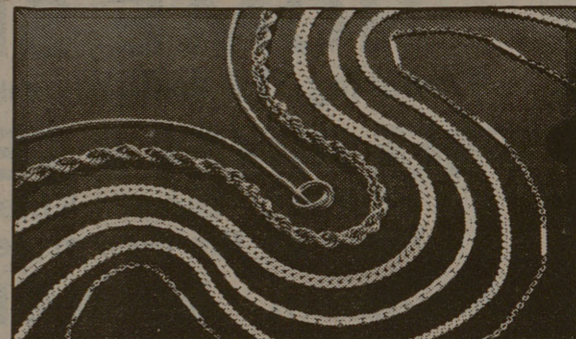

Israel to leave southern Lebanon, secret transfer of authority slated

Israel wants to leave its positions in southern Lebanon in the hands of Christian rightist allies instead of U.N. peace-keeping troops before formally quitting the area Tuesday, a high-ranking Israeli government source said.

Israeli military spokesmen said a formal ceremony marking the transfer of authority was scheduled in the eastern sector of the six-mile "security zone" along the Lebanese frontier. But the spokesmen refused to name the site or the participants.

"Almost all of their main units are out," a Western diplomat in Beirut said of the Israelis. "They've got about 1,000 men in there they can fold up pretty quickly."

But a high-ranking government source in Tel Aviv said Monday it appeared that the rightist militias will be given control of the border zone since, "It's Christian territory, they live there, and we did not go in to fight them."

Lebanese leftist sources said the departing Israelis had already turned many of their positions over to the Christian forces led by Maj. Saad Haddad in Marjayoun.

Yet a U.N. spokesman in Jerusalem said "as far as I know, the Israelis will withdraw and (U.N. troops) will take over."

Behind the conflicting statements is a bitter dispute between Israel and Maj. Gen. Emmanuel Erskine, head of the U.N. peace-keeping force.

In a weekend interview, Erskine charged that Israel's refusal to turn the area over to his troops forced him to deal with the Christians.

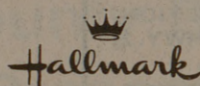

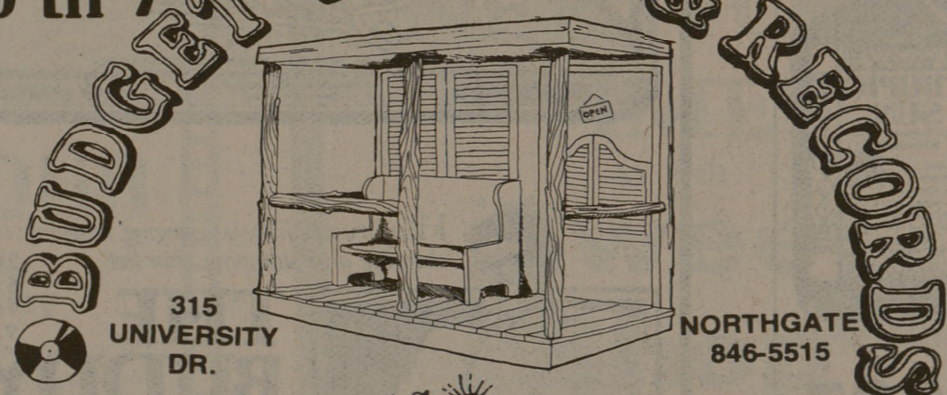

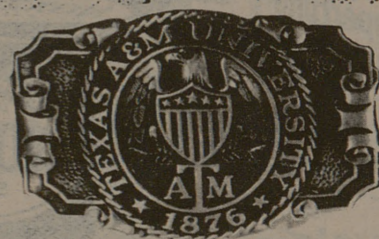
