## 'Problems are their job'

# Scott receives grant to continue research

Most people would like to have a job free of problems. As for the people at the Personal Counseling Service, problems are their job.

Personal counselors help students solve problems ranging from an irritating roommate to a suicidal desire. And the number of students who use the service in the YMCA building is more than enough to keep the nine counselors busy.

Almost 1,200 students participated in counseling last year, said Dr. Wade Birch, director of the Personal Counseling Service. The number of students using the service this year is expected to increase, Birch said.

Ninety percent of the students are "normal," Birch said, meaning that they aren't losing weight or undergoing other changes because of their problems. Approximately four counseling sessions are needed to help most students. Few students need to come in for more than a semester, Birch said. If a student needs long-term counseling, he is referred to a more appropriate facility.

Several types of counseling services are available. All are paid for through the student health center fee.

Personal-social counseling accounts for half of the Service's work. It deals with individual concerns ranging from a relationship problem with parents to a value decision about drinking or pre-marital sex. "We don't tell people what to do," Birch said. Counselors help the student identify alternatives and decide for himself.

Marriage counseling is a growing area for the service, Birch said. It takes about 15 percent of the counselors' time, he added. A counselor visits the married student apartments weekly making this service available to mothers who must re-

main home with children or to those who lack transportation from the apartments.

The Personal Counseling Service cooperates with Beutel Health Service to provide counseling on human sexuality. Topics include family planning, unwanted pregnancy, communicable diseases and sex roles.

Birch said pregnancy counseling attempts to help women identify their feelings about abortion, adoption and other alternatives so that they can make a decision between the alternatives. Birch said the majority of women seeking pregnancy counseling do so in October or February. He attributes this to the fact that many women become pregnant during vacation, but do not find out until they are back in school.

Confidentiality of the student's affairs is assured, Birch said.

"We guard confidentiality jealously," he said. Birch added that parents who call the service will be refused information about their son or daughter. The only exception is danger to life, as in a serious suicide or homicide threat. In those cases, the campus health service or campus police may be notified. Otherwise, the student's right to confidentiality is upheld.

The Personal Counseling Service also has an information library and tests to help those who are interested in career counseling. In this respect they overlap somewhat with the Academic Counseling Center, which usually counsels students on vocational choice.

"Actually, the name is a little misleading," said Dr. Arthur Tollefson, director of the Academic Counseling Service. Academic Counseling has several functions besides assisting students with vocational decisions.

The center conducts research on student characteristics, organizes summer conferences for incoming freshmen, coordinates national learning programs and helps students with academic difficulties, Tollefson said.

When it comes to vocational counseling, Tollefson said, the center has to deal mainly with two types of students. The first type is the "super boy scouts." This type of student has idealistic expectations about a job but no real knowledge of the rigors involved.

For instance, a student grows up in a city with no wilderness experience. He imagines the glamour of the job, but counselors also point out the realities to him. They help him find a new direction.

Another kind of student that counselors often see is one who never had to study and was challenged in school. Consequently, the student has not realized his potential yet. The Academic Counseling Center provides a test program to help these students choose a vocation.
