# Former Manpower director pleads guilty in funds misapplication case

**BROWNSVILLE** — The former director of the Hidalgo County anti-poverty agency pleaded guilty Tuesday to two federal charges in the Texas Manpower scandal.  
Eliseo Sandoval, former director of the Associated City-City Economic Development Corp. of Edinburg, also agreed to be a witness against other defendants indicted by state and federal grand juries in the case.  
Sandoval entered guilty pleas before U.S. District Judge Reynaldo Garza to charges of conspiracy and misapplication of federal funds.  
Garza accepted the guilty pleas to two of 40 counts against Sandoval in eight cases of theft of Manpower funds, on the condition that Sandoval cooperate with the FBI and testify under immunity in state and federal trials of other defendants.

The judge warned Sandoval against perjuring himself in future testimony.  
"When you testify, I want it to be the truth. Don't try to lie your way into an easy sentence. You know a lot of things and could be a lot of help," Garza told Sandoval.  
Sandoval admitted that between March and August of 1976 he conspired with co-defendant Eduardo Ramirez, auditor for the EEODC, to misapply funds. Sandoval said he issued Ramirez two advances of \$7,500 and \$6,500, which later went into a private joint venture between

the two men known as "R&S Janitorial Service."  
The second count charged Sandoval issued a \$6,085.87 ACCEDC check to cover a personal loan he made at the Metropolitan National Bank of McAllen.  
Maximum punishment on the first count is five years in prison and a \$10,000 fine. The second count carries maximum punishment of two years in prison and a \$10,000 fine.  
Garza said he would pronounce sentence after returning from vacation on Aug. 14, at which time he should have a report from federal probation officers on how Sandoval

cooperates in the investigation.  
Garza plans to press charges against five other defendants in a hearing scheduled for U.S. District Judge Forro Galveston in the case of brothers, Don and Carlos, and their secretary, Geal, who received a charge of Manpower charges. I in

# Hotel slated for demolition collapses, kills nearby motorists

**VICTORIA** — At least one person was killed and as many as five others were trapped after an old, four-story hotel collapsed Tuesday.  
Authorities immediately sealed off a five-block area around the Denver Hotel, and one reporter said the scene looked like "just one big giant pile of cement chunks."  
The man who was killed was standing on a sidewalk outside the hotel, which was being prepared for demolition. He was killed when the front wall collapsed onto the sidewalk and street.

The victim was not immediately identified.  
As many as five other workers were believed trapped in a basement area of the building.  
"The whole thing collapsed — not a thing was left standing" said a reporter. He said the inside of the building was being prepared for demolition but the actual destruction of walls and beams had not begun.  
Cars on an adjacent street were buried in the collapse as Civil Defense, police, fire and other rescue

units began sifting through the rubble.  
An estimated 100 people were believed trapped inside.  
"We have all our men there," said a spokesman for the Victoria Police Department. He said seven officers at the sheriff's office is on duty. There are reports four sons are trapped inside.  
The old four-story hotel was being demolished for a parking lot, officials said it collapsed.

# Labor group vows to fight plan to cut government tax hike power

**AUSTIN** — The United Labor Legislative Committee of the Texas AFL-CIO voted unanimously Tuesday to oppose Gov. Dolph Briscoe's proposals to require a two-thirds vote of the Legislature or local governments to increase taxes.  
"This is minority rule," said Harry Hubbard, president of the AFL-CIO and chairman of the legislative committee.  
"This country was founded on the democratic vote, and now the same right-wing majority that has always opposed progressive legislation wants to hamstring our legislative bodies."

Bullock said he was out with friends Monday night, his 49th

birthday. He said he was with friends back to their car, said Bullock, was in the direction of his north home.
