Gardening students involved in energy conference here

Texas A&M University is hosting more than 150 high school students and adult leaders from 46 states this week for the National Youth Conference on Energy and Environmental Problems.

These students are involved in gardening programs in their home states and are attending the week-long session as guests of the Shell Oil Co. The program is co-sponsored by the National Council of State Garden Clubs, Inc.

Robert H. Rucker, conference chairman, said the participants will attend programs exploring the current energy and environmental problems.

Among the speakers for the conference is Dr. Linn Draper of the University of Texas at Austin. Draper is considered one of the top nuclear consultants in the nation, Rucker said.

Mrs. William J. Hedley of Clayton, Mo., president of the Na-

Researcher says universities must step up bilingual programs

Universities must step up their bilingual education programs if schools are to meet new policies adopted by the State Board of Education, says a Texas A&M University researcher.

The new policy, effective this year, makes bilingual education for limited English-speaking children mandatory through the fifth grade with additional English language

training provided through the 12th grade.

Dr. Jesus Garcia, an educational curriculum and instruction professor who has done research in multicultural education, sees the new policy as a step in the right direction.

"This new policy is basically a good idea, but it means the schools are going to have to make some changes," Garcia said. "It also means

the universities will have to

review their curriculum to fill these positions. "Universities will have more money into bilingual education," he said. "I don't think new programs, just coming out of the ones we have."

"My concern is that the state is trying to do bilingual education, but they see it as the cost. Garcia continued. "That add to the problem that of Education is trying to

Under the current bilingual education in Texas for fourth and fifth grade policy, approved under adoption, will make bilingual programs state supported.

The Texas Education review school districts under the new districts failing to make the effort" will be subject to retention review, Garcia said.

In conjunction with this, the state board has tougher standards for teachers. Effective this year, teachers must complete 120 hours of graduate work in education to be considered

"I believe the policies is to make English-speaking children able, and then begin to English language," explained.
