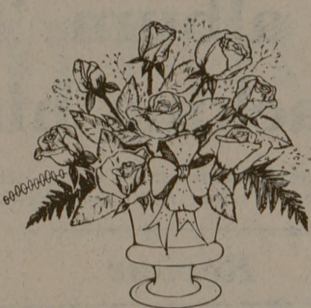

San Antonio police officers escort garbage collectors through pickets

SAN ANTONIO — While city manager Tom Huebner gained citizen support for his mass firings of striking garbage collectors, police Tuesday had to escort replacements through jeering, rock-throwing pickets.

No one was injured in the latest incident in the three-day wildcat strike and no new arrests were reported.

Huebner asked for and received last Friday backing from the majority of the council, threatening to fire anyone who went on strike in violation of Texas law against work stoppages by public employees.

And Citizen Action Center at city hall, where someone dumped garbage on the steps overnight, said telephone calls were running in favor of Huebner's tough stance on firing anyone who goes on strike.

In past years, city bus drivers staged several strikes with no repercussions from former city councilors.

However, two Mexican-American city councilmen called Huebner's resignation and said they would bring the matter up at today's council meeting.

Mayor Lila Cockrell called the move by councilmen Rudy and Bernardo Eusebio "absurd" and said eight of the 11 council members gave their advance blessing to firings.

About 80 percent of the 300 garbage collectors, who earn an average \$759 gross pay a month, against the dismissal threat and walked Saturday demanding a 9.3 percent wage increase and improved working conditions. By Tuesday, Huebner had fired about 100 of them and had begun sending replacements.

The American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees refused to honor the move by the San Antonio Refuse Collectors Association and accepted the city's six percent offer.

As many as 10 air pollution workers joined the picket Tuesday, and the animal shelter center was operating with a skeleton crew. Most other city workers ignored the refuse union's picket line.

Inflation is going up over 10 percent a year, and then they want to give us five percent? That's striking mechanic Lee Smith. "The city has money to send their wives and kids to college in San Francisco at city expense. A man works hard for 20 to 25 years and he's out there living in a trailer."

One burly striker yelled, "I'm taking our jobs. You'll be some police force strikers to come down the street and allow a city bus strike-breakers to enter the picket line."

One non-striker told police shots were fired at his house Tuesday, but investigating said they found no evidence of a strike. Several others said they threatened and feared to work garbage trucks.

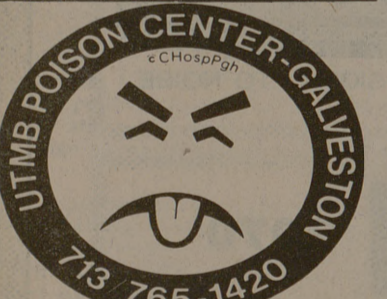

Hobby tax relief proposal

AUSTIN — The sponsor's major tax reform bill Tuesday caused the House Ways and Means Committee of deliberately action on his proposal.

Lt. Gov. William P. Hobby's proposal is scheduled to be heard by the Senate Finance Committee today and is expected to reach a Senate vote by Thursday.

The committee heard testimony last week on Hobby's proposal but took no action to send it to the full House for consideration.

The House chamber was busy Tuesday for hearings before a committee on a bill by Rep. Nugent, D-Kerrville, and Naders, D-Brownwood. The bill called for dedication of one-half of the state sales tax revenue to school districts, with a corresponding reduction in local property taxes.
