## U.S. dollar hits new record low

TOKYO — The dollar fell to another record low in Tokyo, Zurich Wednesday and mixed on other European markets.  
With the dollar closing on Tokyo foreign exchange market an unprecedented 184.70, Japanese Prime Minister Fukuda said he will send a message to the United States to denounce the deteriorating international monetary situation.  
In a meeting with financial adviser Michiya Matsui, Fukuda emphasized the need to change views on the issue and yen's steep climb following month economic summit in Bonn.  
Swiss dealers said the latest plunge in Zurich was mainly to the strengthening of the yen.  
Trading in Zurich was very weak with the dollar opening at 1.7130. Swiss francs against Monday's close of 1.7345, the lowest low. The markets in Zurich were closed Tuesday for a holiday.  
The dollar opened in Frankfurt at 2.0460 mark, 2.0370, in Brussels at 32.862 guilder francs compared with 32.8 in Amsterdam at 2.2090 guilder against 2.1985.  
In London the pound opened Wednesday at \$1.9255, down \$1.9270 at Tuesday's close.  
The dollar in Paris began at 4.3630 French francs, down 4.3670. In Milan it opened at lire against 840.70 the previous day.

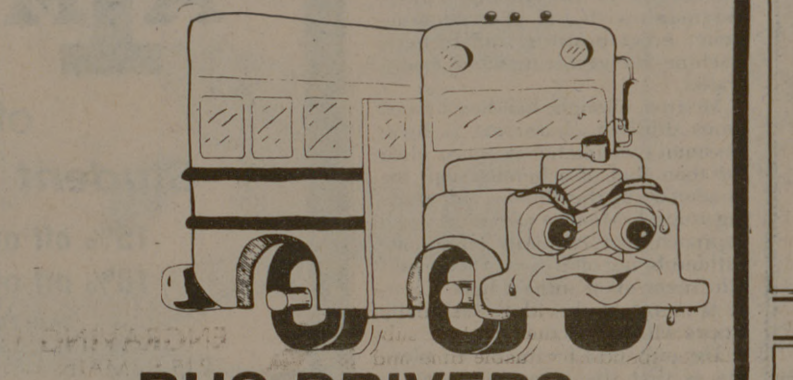

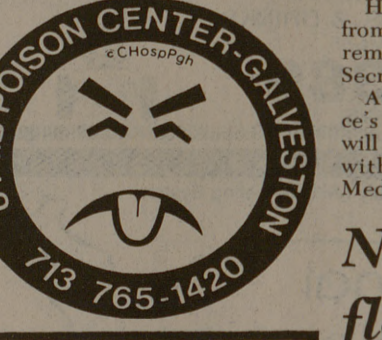

### Reporters receives summons

MOSCOW — New York reporter Craig Whitney Wednesday received a summons to appear in court for failing to comply with a Soviet court order to print a portion of an article judged libelous.  
Whitney, 34, said the legal action he has received indicated it was necessary to show up for trial.  
"I don't plan to go to court," he said.  
The legal action also was a step to the issuance of a \$750 fine for failing to comply with a court order.  
Whitney and Hal Piper, 37, Baltimore Sun, were convicted in 1977 of slander for writing an article which friends of dissident Georgias said the television newsman had been fabricated.  
The two reporters were ordered to pay more than \$3,000 in costs and print a retraction in the Soviet or American newspaper.  
The deadline for printing a retraction was Wednesday.  
American reporters refused to print.

### Envoy hopes for more talks with Egypt

TEL AVIV, Israel — U.S. Alfred Atherton returned to Jerusalem Wednesday saying he feels the chance for the negotiations with Egypt to resume.  
"I am convinced the peace process will continue," Atherton said.  
Atherton's arrival in Jerusalem was the first since he failed to persuade the Egyptian government to join another round of face-to-face talks with Israeli leaders.  
He said he brought no message from Cairo to Jerusalem and remain in Israel until the arrival of Secretary of State Cyrus Vance.  
Attention is now focused on the arrival in Israel Saturday of Egyptian President Sadat, probably at the Mediterranean city of Alexandria.

### North India floods kill 260 persons

NEW DELHI, India — More than 260 persons and caused nearly million worth of damage, government said Wednesday.  
Bhanu Pratap Singh, minister for agriculture and irrigation, told parliament that monsoon rains have affected more than seven million people in the states of Assam, Bihar and Uttar Pradesh.  
He said 2.5 million acres of land have been damaged, and nearly 200,000 houses. The damage thus far was put at 1 million.
