

Legislator appeals ruling

House speaker challenged

AUSTIN — A Dallas legislator Tuesday appealed a parliamentary ruling of Speaker Bill Clayton in the strongest challenge of a presiding speaker's authority in the Texas House in 17 years.

Rep. John Bryant, D-Dallas, appealed Clayton's ruling that language inserted into a conference committee report on a proposed constitutional amendment was within House rules.

The appeal meant Clayton had to sk another member to preside and allow House members to debate whether his ruling in the issue

should be upheld. "I recognize the futility of appealing the ruling of the chair on the last night of a session," Bryant said.

emphasized that the rules of the House were written to be followed, not written to be abrogated simply because we ran out of time.


