## Super Bowl rematch: Cowboys vs. Broncos

**THOUSAND OAKS, Calif.** — The Dallas Cowboys will use basically the same lineup that defeated the Denver Broncos in Super Bowl XII in the teams' exhibition rematch Saturday in Mile High Stadium.

Team spokesmen said Saturday's starting lineup for the nationally televised game in Denver would be basically the same as the one that defeated the Broncos, 27-10, in January at New Orleans.

The only changes expected are at

the offensive tackle positions. Ralph Neely has retired and Rayfield Wright continues to have problems with a knee that required surgery last summer.

Pat Donovan, the 1977 starter at right tackle, will start in Neely's left tackle spot and second-year man Andy Frederick will start at right tackle if Wright is unable to play.

The Cowboys will return to Thousand Oaks following the Denver game for their final week of camp. The Cowboys will return to

Dallas to stay Aug. 18, the day before their game with Houston at Texas Stadium.

Meanwhile, in Denver, Broncos head coach Red Miller said his team "might be starting a couple of different people because we have a very good competition for jobs at several positions."

Miller said the Broncos resumed practice Tuesday with an afternoon workout, and the coaching staff began game preparations later in the day.

The Broncos coach cited offensive linemen Bill Bryan and Steve Schindler for outstanding work in the club's 17-12 win over the Houston Oilers last Saturday and said he was pleased with the progress of several of Denver's injured players.

Wide receiver John Schultz worked out in full pads Tuesday despite sustaining bruised ribs in the Houston game, and running back Otis Armstrong, nose tackle Don Latimer and defensive back Chris Pane all participated more in the workout than they have in the past two weeks.

Miller said defensive end Gary Silvestri would be out for two weeks with a dislocated shoulder and nose tackle Ernie Salley probably would miss the Dallas game because of a mild concussion sustained last week.

## University hires new tennis coach

David Kent, who led West Texas State University to six Missouri Valley Conference titles during the past eight seasons, will head up Texas A&M's men's and women's tennis programs, effective Sept. 1, athletic director Emory Bellard announced Wednesday.

The 42-year-old Amarillo native and Texas Tech graduate replaces Aggie men's coach Richard Barker who has resigned to become a teacher and rancher in his hometown of San Saba. Ellen Buchanan will continue with the A&M women's program, working closely with Kent.

Kent was an outstanding player at both Amarillo High School and Texas Tech and has had successful coaching tenures at Amarillo, Midland High School and West Texas State.

He was a state doubles finalist in 1954, his senior year. Amarillo. Kent was captain of the Texas Tech tennis team three years, 1956-57-58, and won straight singles matches in his senior season of 1958.

While coaching at Midland where his teams compiled 114-10 dual-meet record, he won the city men's singles championship eight straight years. He is still active in tournament play.

His teams at West Texas State compiled a dual-meet record of 198 wins and 62 losses against top competition.

He also has vast experience directing summer tennis camps and tournaments and is recognized as one of the top tennis instructors in the nation.

**MISSION, Kan.** — Grambling State University has been placed on a year's probation by the NCAA for violations in both the university's football and basketball programs, the NCAA said Wednesday.

The violations found by the NCAA's committee on infractions related primarily to the improper administration of financial aid to student-athletes, the NCAA said.

though violations of NCAA regulations governing the payment of recruiting expenses were also found.

The NCAA said the sanction will prohibit the school from participating in intercollegiate football and basketball teams from participating in postseason competition and appearing on NCAA-controlled television programs during the 1978-79 season.
