






Dorms over-assigned

Still no room in the inn

Many men assigned to temporary quarters after too many men were assigned to dorm rooms still did not know their future place of residence Tuesday. The students were without rooms even after Texas A&M University claimed its "no shows" Monday evening.

Ron Sasse, assistant director of student affairs, said the housing situ-

ation was too hectic to determine an exact number of men without rooms.

Sasse said he thought a space could be made on campus for every over-assigned student. He said additional spaces would become available when some students withdrew from the University.

"Some students may have to remain in dormitory lounges and study rooms," Sasse said, but added that the number of students living in each

room still be reduced to about 10. He said some students will be placed in empty spaces in the Corporationitories.

Sasse also said room fees would be reduced for those students living in temporary housing.

He did not know how long it would take to settle the students on new room rates.

"We know it will take longer than we'd like," he said.

Jury selected in Kentucky for first self-abortion trial

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. — A jury has been chosen to hear the case against the first woman in American history to be tried on charges of performing an abortion on herself.

Marla Elaine Pitchford, 22, is being prosecuted under a state law allowing only licensed doctors to perform abortions. If convicted, she could be sentenced to 10 to 20 years in prison.

Pitchford stared at the courtroom floor while the jury was selected Monday. Occasionally she held her head and wiped tears from her eyes.

Her trial is being viewed as a national test case involving women's rights and representatives of several feminist organizations, including the National Organization of Women, were in the courtroom Monday.

"The charge against Marla Pitchford is a violation of every woman's right," said Helen Kuester of NOW's Louisville chapter.

Pitchford's attorneys, who said they plan to base their case on a plea of temporary insanity, said the trial was unique.

"This is the first time in the nation's history that a woman has been tried for performing an abortion on herself," said public defender Flora Stewart.

Pitchford was indicted June 14 by a Warren County grand jury on charges of manslaughter and performing an illegal abortion on June 9 when she was five to six months pregnant.

The prosecution contends it used a knitting needle to perform the abortion.

Judge J. Davis Francis dropped the manslaughter charge at a trial hearing on grounds a fetus is not legally a person. But he granted motions by the defense to overrule the indictment on grounds it violates equal protection under U.S. Constitution.

Two days after Pitchford alleged she performed the self-abortion she admitted to Bowling Green-Warren County Hospital for treatment shortly after was questioned by police. In pretrial hearings, her attorney Linda said she visited Pitchford's room and found her upset about a statement she made to police. Her testimony said she signed it apparently without seeing since she was not wearing her glasses.

The judge refused to throw out the police statement.

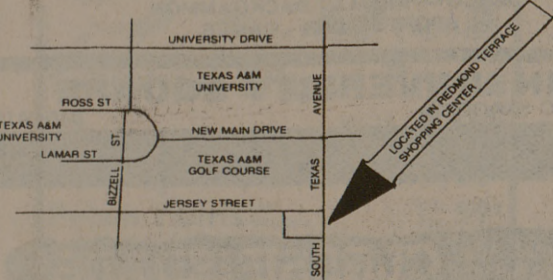
