Ags, U.S. team doing well

The United States staged a 19-hit attack in defeating Belgium 15-0 Tuesday and remain undefeated in the XXV World Amateur Baseball Championship Tournament in Italy. The U.S. and Cuba are the only unbeaten teams in the tournament at this point. The Cubans, who were previously undefeated, defeated Nicaragua 7-2 Tuesday to remain in first-place tie with the U.S. at four wins apiece. After a scoreless first and second inning, the Americans unleashed their attack that ended after seven games when the game was called due to the 10-run rule. Kyle Hawthorne of Texas A&M hit the entire game and was 4-for-5 at the plate. Aggie outfielder Mike Hurdle was 1-for-4.

Terry Francona of Arizona was the leading hitter for the U.S. going 4-for-6 with a triple. Tom Lukish of the University of Houston was the winning pitcher for the Americans. He hurled five innings, allowed two hits and struck out 11. Atlee Hammaker of East Tennessee State pitched the final two frames for the U.S. "We've really been hitting the ball well the last couple of games," U.S. coach Tom Chandler reported from Bologna Tuesday. "Our game with Cuba on Sept. 5 is being billed as the top game of the tournament. I'm sure there will be an excellent crowd and the game is going to be nationally televised throughout Italy." The U.S. will play Holland today in Parma. The starting pitcher will

be Tim Leary of UCLA with Mark Ross of Texas A&M scheduled to come in relief. first three games of the Tournament for the U.S. Coach Tom Chandler of Texas A&M reports that the ballparks the tournament games are being played in are "comparable to Disch-Falk Field in Austin and even Olsen Field at A&M." The World Tournament is considered the Olympics of amateur baseball since baseball is not included as an official Olympic sport. Scores from other games Tuesday: Cuba 7, Nicaragua 2; Korea 5, Japan 4; Mexico 3, Canada 2. Today's game with Holland will be the U.S.' first day game of the tournament; its first three bouts were played under the lights.

Campbell, Renfro to start

HOUSTON — Last year it took the Heisman Trophy winner — Tony Dorsett — half a season to win starting spot with the Dallas Cowboys. The most recent Heisman winner — Earl Campbell — will start right away. Just before he announced his final roster cuts, Oilers coach Bum Phillips said Tuesday former Southwest Conference stars and Oilers rookies Campbell and Mike Renfro will start Sunday's game at Atlanta. Phillips announced he has re-

leased old pros Zeke Moore and Jerrel Wilson in the continuation of a youth movement which will be immediately obvious in the Oilers' first regular season game. Also on Houston's list of waived players were eight-year veteran lineman Kevin Hunt, third-year quarterback Tommy Duniven and free agents Johnny Dirken and Guido Merkins. Two released players who are not claimed by another team can be re-signed later today to bring the final roster to 45 players. Unless the Oilers resign Duniven or acquire another quarterback, they will face Atlanta with only two quarterbacks, Dan Pastorini and rookie Gifford Nielsen. Phillips said his decision to start Heisman Trophy winner Campbell was easy since the rookie led Oilers rushers in preseason with 265 yards and a 5.6-yard average. Campbell will start opposite second-year pro Tim Wilson.

"They earned it," Phillips said of the running back pair. Renfro caught only two passes for 37 yards in preseason, but injuries suffered by Billy Johnson and Eddie Foster moved the all-time leading SWC pass catcher from TCU into the lineup. Unless Johnson recovers fully from a hyperextended knee suffered 12 days ago he will see only limited


