# Holtz likes defense

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. — Arkansas Coach Lou Holtz is pleased with the progress of the Razorback defensive unit.

"The defense, especially the secondary, is coming together," Holtz said Monday. "That is more than can be expected after a scrimmage."

Sophomore Trent Bryant and junior Marty Mitcham were elevated to first team positions Monday. Bryant was moved to starting free safety and Mitcham was promoted at defensive right end.

Freshman Thomas Brown was moved to wide receiver. "I thought Brown had a fine practice," Holtz said. "He has good hands and good speed."

"Micheal (Forrest), Roland (Sales) and Ben (Cowins) all had fine days," he said. But Holtz added, "Our offense doesn't have the continuity we need. Anytime you put in new things after a scrimmage, there will be mistakes."

"We have a lot of people playing with pain," Holtz said. "I think the competition is keeping the players on the field despite some bumps and bruises."

Senior strong safety Brad Shoup missed the workout because of a hip pointer, and senior running back Jerry Eckwood was slowed by a foot injury. Neither injury is serious, and both are expected to return in a day or two.

Meanwhile, surgery to repair ligament damage to first-team flanker Donny Bobo's knee was called successful by Arkansas Razorback trainer Dean Weber.

Bobo suffered the injury in Saturday's scrimmage. "The goal is still to have him completely ready for a bowl game," Weber said.

Junior Robert Farrell was moved up to Bobo's starting position Monday's practice. Farrell, a junior, caught a 58-yard touchdown pass to give the Razorbacks a 26-20 victory over Texas A&M last year.

COLLEGE STATION — Texas A&M assistant coach Chuck Moser said Tuesday Aggie kickers Tony Franklin and David Appleby were in better form than ever.

"I timed David's hang-time 10 times the other day and all of his punts were in the air at least four seconds," said Moser. "The best one was 5.2 seconds and that's the best I've ever timed. Appleby's a lot stronger this year and more consistent."
