Retiring dean of business at A&M honored recently

 An appreciation dinner was given this week in the Memorial Student Center for Dr. John Pearson, Texas A&M University's first dean of the

College of Business Administration. Pearson is retiring from the position after 10 years. He will still be employed by the college as a professor in the department of Management.

It was announced that a scholarship has been established by the College of Business Administration. The size of the scholarship has not yet been determined. Harry Zenger, chairman of the appreciation dinner committee, said contributions to establish the scholarship are being accepted and have been for the past two months.

A portrait of Pearson was unveiled at the dinner and will be presented to the University.

Pearson came to Texas A&M in 1963 and was director of the school of Business. He was named dean of the College of Business Administration when it opened in 1968.

Dr. Ted Anthony, an associate professor in the department of Business Analysis and Research, who was a student of Dr. Pearson's 20 years ago on August 29, was Mas-

ter of Ceremonies at the dinner. Other speakers at the dinner included: Dr. Richard Wainwright, former vice president of the College of Business Administration; Dr. Samuel Giles, director of the marketing department; Robert Strawser, associate dean of the College of Business Administration; and Mr. Bookman, President of City National Bank.

"The expression of warm kindness was overwhelming," Pearson said. "It simply had to be the most special moment in my life."

During Pearson's tenure at the College of Business Administration has tripled in enrollment. A graduate program was established where none existed before.

Pearson says he feels the change in the College has been of high quality, evidenced by the fact that both the doctoral and master's students in the College of Business Administration scored higher on their Graduate Record Examination (GRE) exams than any other graduate students in the nation.

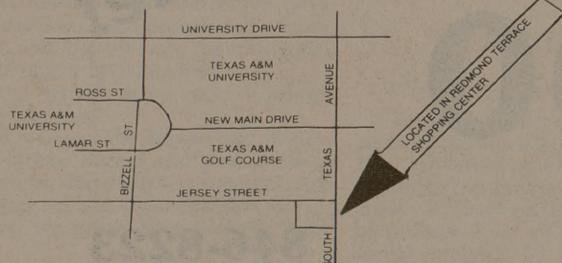

Man-killing food!

WASHINGTON — World Wide Institute says a "biological massacre" is imminent, with evolution distorted by the acceleration of extinction of plant and animal species on earth. It said most of the species lost will be plants, and said for each plant 10 to 30 species along the food chain also die. The final result, it said, will be a "more hostile environment for man."

It said one animal or plant species per hour may become extinct by the end of this century because of actions of man. Worldwide development, killing animals for food and profit, and toxic chemicals such as pesticides and industrial wastes. The food life will not just suffer a minor sections of it will be torn to shreds, the paper warned.
