Following what can be safely called the longest road trip of their young careers, the United States World Tournament team returns home today after winning the silver medal for second place at the World Amateur Baseball Championship Tournament in Italy

Senior catcher Buster Turner did not see any action until the U.S.' final game against Nicaragua when he went 0-1.




Final ceremonies for the tourna-ment were held Wednesday night in Bologna, Italy before a crowd of 12,000.
