





FRESNO, Calif. — They're bugged by too many crickets, so a group of Coalinga Chamber of Commerce representatives asked Gov. Edmund G. Brown Jr., Wednesday for state help in stamping them out.
"We have literally been overrun by crickets," said spokesman George Lacy. "There is not a house, store or office in the town that has not had to sweep piles of crickets out the door almost daily."
The subject came up as Brown prepared to speak to a group of Fresno County cotton growers. Lacy asked for a few moments of the governor's time then read a formal letter detailing the cricket problem. No one has been able to come up with a solution, he said.

Dinners to raise cash for Hill and Clements

AUSTIN, Texas — Democratic governor candidate John Hill and his Republican opponent, Bill Clements, are using fund-raising dinners to finance the final six-week campaign blitz before the November election.
Attorney General Hill estimated a Wednesday dinner would generate \$725,000 — allowing his campaign to make its budget.
"If that estimate proves correct then there will be no money problems in our campaign because it will enable us to meet our campaign budget of \$1.1 million," Hill told a news conference called to announce formation of an organization of county officials to support him.
Although \$725,000 raised at one dinner is considered a small amount even by Texas standards, Clements has even plans for a dinner in Dallas week.
The star attractions will be Reagan, former President Ford, John Connally and George Bush and tickets will sell for \$200 each. Clements has predicted have 2,000 people at the dinner bringing in \$2 million in one night.
Hill said Wednesday he is prepared for the expected blitz by Clements, a Dallas attorney.
"He will be very competitive the last six weeks regardless of how much money is spent by the side, and I'm sure that will be a deal," Hill said.
Clements has claimed support from persons who are not in the Democratic primary, he said. Hill dismissed the impact of those switches.
"At least 95 percent of the campaign have publicly stated our side," he said.
McLennan County Judge Thomas of Waco and County Commissioner Ann Richards called the news conference Tuesday to announce formation of an organization of county officials support Hill.
"In the whole history of our state as far as politics is concerned, has never been a formal organization of county officials supporting gubernatorial candidate," he said.
"The courtesies of this state are coming together to formalize broad and deep support by county officials of this state for John Hill," he said.
Hill told the county officials that elected governor he will not pass any legislation requiring expenditures by local government unless the state also provides reimbursement for the local government.
