Bryant had a hearty laugh Monday night as former players and coaches from around the nation emerged from a darkened room to pay tribute to the crusty coach of the top-ranked Crimson Tide at the Birmingham Touchdown Club.


Ali said his weight was right at 220 pounds, four pounds lighter than when he arrived in New Orleans
