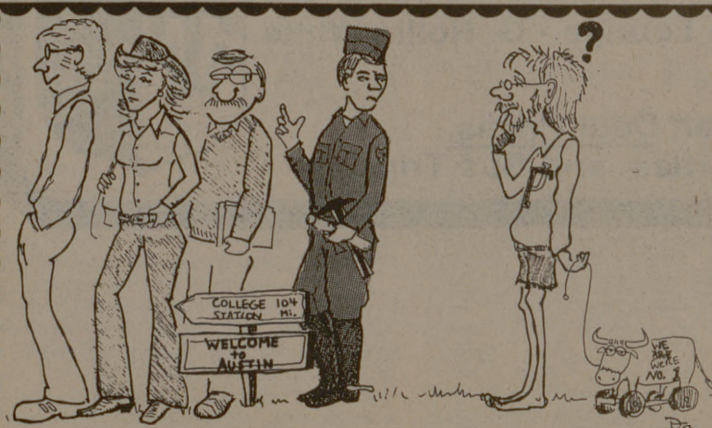

Grown-up games NATO starts 'war' in Europe

United Press International SCHOTTEN, West Germany — As the rat-a-tat of gunfire echoed through the hill country of West Germany, tanks rolled across roads built for Volkswagens. Children witnessing the conflict laughed and went about their play.

The grown-up games that began this week 30 miles north of Frankfurt are known as Operation Certain Shield, part of NATO's fall maneuvers in Europe. About 13,000 American soldiers — regulars, National Guard and reservists — and 48 F-4 Phantom fighter-bombers were flown to Europe to take part. "These are the most massive maneuvers since the time of Kaiser Wilhelm II," said Gen. Franz Josef Schulze, the West German who is NATO's Supreme Commander, Allied Forces Central Europe.

Of course, since the last time "Kaiser Bill" watched maneuvers, larger groups of men have warred in earnest in Europe. In all, 60,000 soldiers from five nations were fighting the symbolic war.

Without warning, an American soldier of the Blue Army "fired" a burst from his .50-caliber machine gun — no bullets were used — at an Orange Army scout vehicle. To make sure his adversaries knew he was killing them, the soldier yelled, "Pow! Pow! Kapow!" Not far away, a British Special

Forces soldier squatting at a busy village intersection squeezed the trigger of his antitank weapon at an Orange armored monster cresting a hill.

"That's a kill, mate," a fellow Blue soldier declared. Umpires who witnessed the "slaughter" ordered the wounded to wear bandages dyed red and strap on plastic gore imitating injuries. Sometimes a roll of the dice decided the winner of a major engagement.

German children found the whole affair highly amusing, giggling at the soldiers' antics as they rode their bicycles in the shadow of huge M-60 tanks.

"In a real war, we would have the administrative constraints here today," said Lt. Joseph Hardesty, of Frankfurt.

"We let them do their thing there," said Capt. Bob Sals Pollock Pines, Calif., who described himself as "the voice of unpopularity." "There are no false restraints only time we might stop them the forces get all scrambled somebody might get hurt. But even soldiers in a face danger."

The West German news agency DPA reported that by Tuesday evening, 13 persons had been injured in the maneuvers but they were run over by tanks.
