CLEVELAND — Cleveland
Browns owner Art Modell announced Sunday fans attending future Browns home games will not be permitted to enter the stadium with containers, bottles

Modell said containers, bottles or cans will be confiscated at the entrance gates before fans are admitted

Modell's action stemmed from a bottle and can throwing melee that began in the east end zone grandstand of Municipal Stadium Sunday, following a disputed call by officials in the late stages of the Houston-Cleveland game.

Several players, mostly on the Oilers team, were hit by things thrown from the stands by fans. The melee last so long that officials were forced to move the play to the other end of the field.


