The money received for the program is used to buy supplies, Barnard said, but the labor must come from somewhere else. We have tried to get volunteers, such as church groups, to help us but we have been unsuccessful in that area," Barnard said.

Wayne Sadbury, director of CETA, said there is a labor project submitted to the TDCA for the weatherization program. "The project has not been approved yet, and until it is, we can't supply any labor," he said.






