Organization for Women has voted to continue for at least a year the "state of emergency" it declared before Congress approved additional time to win ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment.

NOW's national convention, which began Sunday in Washington, spent little time cele-brating last week's ERA victory and considerable time planning what women leaders agree will be the hard task of winning the remaining three states needed to put the amendment into the Constitution. NOW's president, Eleanor Smeal, said in a keynote address Sunday night that a coalition of more than 300 groups, including




