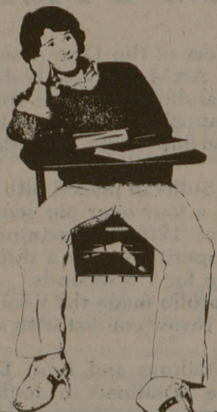

HEW takes new stand Doctor surplus cited

NEW ORLEANS — By the year 1990, health care in the United States could be a \$1-trillion-a-year industry unless medical schools reduce the number of students and encourage doctors to become general practitioners instead of specialists, says HEW Secretary Joseph Califano.

In a speech to the Association of American Medical Colleges Tuesday, Califano told delegates the government would reverse its policies

developed in the 1960s, when a doctor shortage was predicted, and encouraged fewer students to become doctors.

"We will review our reimbursement formulas, which presently discourage ambulatory care, to determine whether they are discouraging students from choosing to involve themselves in primary care," Califano said.

"We will seek to institute programs of support for departments of family medicine and other disciplines

stressing primary care.

"Last week across the nation, newspapers trumpeted the latest estimates of future health costs: \$100 billion for health care — 12 percent of the entire gross national product — by the year 2000," Califano said.

"He said health care presently costs for \$180 billion in fiscal 1978. He said he planned to realize general policies to cut down in the supply of doctors.

New HEW policies will include encouraging medical schools to reduce the size of student bodies, discouraging the opening of a medical school.

Califano also said HEW would longer encourage or assist the opening of new medical schools that would continue its strong opposition to the licensing of foreign medical school graduates.

"And we are seeking ways to deal with the growing problem of American students who return from studying abroad," the secretary said.

Medical schools must revamp curricula to serve the changing needs of the country, especially the needs of the elderly, Califano said.

"More and more physicians are occupied by the elderly and thousands of medical students graduated without ever having entered a nursing home or hospital course in the special health problems of the elderly," he said.

Physician education also needs needed training in ethics, "a concern that grows more important as medicine enters ever more controversial fields — in vitro fertilization, fetal research, organ transplant, psycho-surgery and heroic measures to sustain life," he said.
