#### Sadat and Begin win Nobel Prize

# Leaders praised by countrymen

United Press International efforts at Camp Da OSLO, Norway — Egyptians and sraelis praised their national leaders closed in February. r winning the 1978 Nobel Peace Prize, but the warm words were nged with the tense reality of the talled Washington peace confer-

The citation of the Norwegian Nobel Committee itself said Presi-dent Anwar Sadat of Egypt and Prime Minister Menachem Begin of srael received the award, "not only honor actions already performed, out also to encourage further efforts to work out practical solutions" to-ward a Middle East peace.

That sentiment was pointedly nothing to stop it from praising the president Carter, who was nominated for the prize for his

efforts at Camp David, but repor-tedly lost out because nominations

'Time and again in the last year," Carter said in his message to the

"I know that this award will be an occasion for you and for all of us to rededicate our efforts, for it makes clear how much the people of the world value your search."

### report says stak


United Press International WASHINGTON — Population growth and overuse of vulnerable oils could cause acute hunger for millions of people and higher food prices for everyone, a researcher varned Saturday

Lester Brown, president of Worldwatch Institute, released a study in which he said an expanding world population is taking up more living space just when land is needed urgently to feed the 6.3 billion per-sons projected for the year 2000.

Efforts to feed the existing population of more than 4 billion have

caused deserts to expand, soil erosion to accelerate and productivity to level off, Brown said.

A doubling of demand for food is projected for the last quarter of the century.




