# 'Tortilla Curtain' issue not over yet

MEXICO CITY — A report on Saturday by Mexico's Foreign Ministry, saying the construction of the "Tortilla Curtain" was being held up by the U.S. government, could not be substantiated by a U.S. Embassy spokeswoman.  
Later that same day, the spokeswoman said she could find no trace of a communique reportedly released by the embassy to the Foreign Ministry, saying the U.S. Immigration Service has postponed plans to build a new fence along parts of the United States-Mexico border to prevent the entry of illegal Mexican workers.  
The Foreign Ministry had said it had received a communique from

the U.S. Embassy advising that the fence, to be built along parts of the border near San Diego and El Paso, was being postponed "with a view of carrying out an analysis of the implications of this matter."  
The embassy spokeswoman said as far as she knew, there are only plans to repair existing fences along the border and possible plans for building a new, six-mile fence.

Critics of the proposal on both sides of the border already have dubbed the fence the "Tortilla Curtain."  
On Wednesday, Annie Gutierrez, head of the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service office in Mexico City, said the INS planned only to replace six miles of existing fence and to build six miles of new fence at El Paso, Texas, and San

Ysidro, Calif., the two areas where the largest number of illegal crossings occur.  
Another 7.5-mile section was built in Arizona in the future, she said.  
Funds for the 12 miles of fence were requested in June 1978 and were approved by the U.S. Congress for the fiscal year 1979, she said.

## Up 10 percent in one year Auto operating costs soar

DETROIT — The cost of owning and operating a typical new car in 1978 surged upward more than 10 percent to an average of 33.1 cents per mile or \$3,310 a year, a study by the Hertz Corp. shows.  
The annual survey released Sunday by the car rental and leasing firm was based on a normally equipped, intermediate-size two-door sedan driven 10,000 miles a year and kept for three years.  
Comparable 1977 costs amounted to 30.1 cents a mile or \$3,010 a year, a 7 percent increase over the preceding year, Hertz said.  
Expenses estimated in the study included outlays for fuel, oil, parts,

service, repairs, licenses, fees, interest and depreciation — the difference between a car's purchase price and resale value.  
Hertz said since the 1973 Arab oil embargo, new car costs have climbed more than 64 percent, outpacing by more than one-third a 46.4 percent rise in the Consumer Price Index during the period.  
Most of the 1978 increase was attributed to higher interest rates and insurance premiums — both now more than double their 1973 levels — Hertz said.  
Interest on auto loans climbed from an average 3.08 cents per mile in 1977 to 4.13 cents in 1978, a 34 percent increase for the 12 months

and a 103 percent hike since the report said.  
Insurance expenses rose 15 percent, from 5.60 cents per mile in 1977 to 6.47 cents in 1978. In 1973, insurance costs have shot up 108 percent.  
More fuel-efficient vehicles helped motorists trim their average gasoline expenses for the year 4.06 cents a mile from 4.23 cents a year ago. Average fuel consumption for 10,000 miles of driving dropped from 645 gallons to 588 gallons, Hertz said.  
Other service station items more than 13 percent while maintenance and servicing expenses, by a substantial increase in prices, rose 9 percent during the period, the firm said.

## Israel plans to settle more occupied areas

JERUSALEM — Israel on Monday plans to build about 100 housing units in the occupied territories and has asked the U.S. to pay for the expected 14 agricultural settlements in Sinai desert.

The Zionist Organization released the details of the planned expansion to the national radio and said it needed an additional \$16 million to pay for it. The expansion plan is in line with a cabinet decision last week.  
Settlements will be enlarged in the occupied West Bank of Jerusalem, the Gaza Strip and the Golan Heights of Syria, the head of the organizations Settlement Department, Shimon Raviv, told the radio.  
Details of the planned expansion and news Israel has asked Washington to pay millions of dollars to compensate for the loss of farming settlements in Sinai and relocation of residents there after a secret five-hour session of cabinet.

The 17-member cabinet discussed Egypt's amendments to draft peace treaty and decided to establish committees to deal with economic and Sinai oil aspects of proposed pact.  
After a 75-minute meeting of negotiators with Secretary of State Cyrus Vance, Israeli Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan said, "We are making good progress on very important issues concerning the text of a peace treaty."  
"Nothing was discussed about settlements," he said. "As far as I am concerned, the settlements are a blessing and not an obstacle."  
The state-run Israeli radio meanwhile, said Israeli will ask the United States for \$110 million compensation to relocate the eastern Sinai settlement of Yamit eastward to the Negev.  
In addition, the broadcast said Israel will seek \$150,000 compensation as the price of relocating 800 families in the Yamit area.
