## Large turnover in state election

AUSTIN — Not since 1916 when voters elected five new representatives has the turnover in the Texas congressional delegation been so drastic. Next Tuesday voters will choose no fewer than eight new congressmen and Republicans are hopeful they can wrestle from Democrats some of the open seats. Republicans currently hold only two of the 24 Texas seats.

Reps. George Mahon, W.R. Omar Burleson and Olin Teague who have spent a combined years on Capitol Hill. With will go clout, including chairmanships of two house committees and three subcommittees.

Also gone are Rep. Bob Krueger who left to make a bid for the state, Rep. Barbara Jordan, who ceded Congress perhaps was her political career, and two incumbents — Reps. John Wayne Dale Milford — who were defeated in primary races.

The race to replace Mahon will be the state's most interesting congressional match. Democrat Hance, 35, a state senator in Lubbock, and Republican Bush, 32, son of George Bush the former CIA director, were even born when Mahon first was elected. The winner automatically will become the youngest congressman.

National Republican leaders targeted the 19th District as one they can win and have spent twice as much money as Hance.

The GOP also is going all in to win the seat held by Poage in the past 41 years. Jack Burgess is who almost upset Poage in 1976 challenging Democrat Leath, a Marlin banker and Poage aide.

Charles Stenholm, a Stratton farmer, is expected to win over Bill Fisher, an Abilene attorney and Taylor County GOP man, in the race to replace Poage, a 31-year veteran of Congress.

Phil Gramm, a former A&M University economics professor, is challenging Republican Mowery for Teague's seat. Mowery, who has served in Washington 32 years, is stepping down because of declining health.

Rep. Mickey Leland, D-Houston, defeated six other Democrats to succeed Jordan. Leland has a public opinion but is challenged by Socialist Farrah Vernier.

Rep. Joe Wyatt, D-Bloomington, defeated Young, who has served Congress for 22 years, in the Democratic primary and is running as Republican Joy Yates, a Christi real estate agent with political experience.

Dallas attorney Martin Milford who defeated Milford in the Democratic primary, faces Republican Leo Berman of Arlington, who ran to Milford in 1976.

Rep. Bob Gammage is expected to have a tough fight against Republican Ron Paul of Lake Jackson, former state representative who defeated Gammage several times once beat him.

A Raza Unida candidate, Araceli Mata of San Antonio, serious contender against Rep. Al "Chick" Kazen Jr.

Republican Reps. Jim Collins and Bill Archer both should return to Congress. Collins is unopposed. Archer is expected to defeat Democrat Robert L. Hutchings of Houston.

TO ORDER AT MID-SEMESTER USING MID-SEMESTER GRADES TO FULFILL THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS, PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS:  
1. LEAVE YOUR NAME, MAJOR AND I. D. NUMBER WITH THE RING CLERK, HEATON BUILDING, PRIOR TO NOVEMBER 1ST IF POSSIBLE, OR AT LEAST ONE WEEK IN ADVANCE OF ORDERING. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
