SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE
FOR STUDENTS COMPLETING 92 HOURS AT THE END OF THE FALL '78 SEMESTER TO BE ELIGIBLE TO ORDER THE TEXAS A&M SENIOR CLASS RING, AN UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT MUST HAVE AT LEAST NINETY-TWO (92) SEMESTER HOURS, WITH 30 HOURS AT A&M AND BE IN GOOD STANDING. TO ORDER AT MID-SEMESTER USING MID-SEMESTER GRADES TO FULFILL THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS, PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS:

1. LEAVE YOUR NAME, MAJOR AND I. D. NUMBER WITH THE RING CLERK, HEATON BUILDING, PRIOR TO NOVEMBER 1ST IF POSSIBLE, OR AT LEAST ONE WEEK IN ADVANCE OF ORDERING. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
2. BRING MID-SEMESTER GRADE REPORTS ALONG WHEN READY TO ORDER TO VERIFY PASSING HOURS.
3. ANYONE HAVING FAILED TO LEAVE THEIR NAME IN ADVANCE AND FAIL TO BRING THEIR MID-SEMESTER GRADE REPORT ALONG WHEN READY TO ORDER WILL BE ASKED TO RETURN LATER TO ALLOW TIME FOR RECORDS TO BE CHECKED.
4. ALL RINGS MUST BE PAID FOR IN FULL WHEN THE ORDER IS PLACED. SENIOR RING LOANS ARE AVAILABLE THROUGH STUDENT FINANCIAL AID IN THE YMCA BUILDING.
5. MID-SEMESTER ORDERS WILL BE TAKEN ONLY FROM OCTOBER 30TH UNTIL DECEMBER 1ST, 1978.
6. STUDENTS WHO DO NOT PLACE THEIR ORDER DURING THIS PERIOD MAY ORDER AFTER FINAL GRADES ARE POSTED, THERE WILL ONLY BE A 2-3 WEEK DIFFERENCE IN DELIVERY TIME FOR THOSE STUDENTS ORDERING IN JANUARY. (WHENEVER 92 HOURS HAVE BEEN COMPLETED AND ARE ON RECORD, THERE IS NEVER A DEAD-LINE, EXCEPT A MONTHLY MAILING DATE ON WHICH WE SEND ORDERS TO THE FACTORY).
7. THE RING CLERK IS ON DUTY FROM 8 A.M. TO 5 P.M. EACH DAY, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY. HOWEVER, IN ORDER FOR OTHER DUTIES TO BE CARRIED OUT, ABSOLUTELY NO ORDERS WILL BE TAKEN BETWEEN 11:30 A.M. - 1:00 P.M. OR BETWEEN 4:00 - 5:00 P.M.
8. ALL RINGS ORDERED, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER ON OCTOBER 30TH OR DECEMBER 1ST, WILL BE DELIVERED ON THE SAME DAY WHICH WILL BE APPROXIMATELY FEBRUARY 28, 1978.

Texas A&M University will have 56 students listed in the 1978-79 "Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities."

Graduating seniors and graduate students chosen for the annual directory were announced by Dr. John J. Koldus III, vice president for student services.

Selection and certification by "Who's Who" editors are based on academic achievement, extracurricular activities, leadership, campus-omunity contributions and potential.

Nominations are limited to graduating seniors with a minimum 2.5 grade point ratio and graduate students with at least a 3.5 GPR. Honorees will be recognized at a spring semester reception, Koldus said.

Freshman awarded Mayo essay prize

David Witzel, son of Donald Witzel of 3720 Sweetbriar Drive, Bryan, has been named winner of the third annual Thomas F. Mayo Prize presented at Texas A&M University.

The essay contest is held annually to determine the best expository writer enrolled in English 103, 104, or 104H at Texas A&M.

Witzel's essay was chosen out of 60 entries. He wrote the story

as an assignment for his freshman English class.

The \$100 prize memorializes the head of Texas A&M's English Department from 1944-52, a longtime college librarian, Mayno, one of William Faulkner's teachers and a Rhodes Scholar, died in 1954.

Astronaut donates proceeds to A&M

Former astronaut Frank Borman has designated Texas A&M University's Center for Education and Research in Enterprise as the recipient of one-third of the proceeds from an international fund-raiser dinner in April when he presents the Fund for Higher Education Flame of Truth Award.

Borman, president of Eastern Airlines, commanded the manned voyage around the moon, Apollo 8, on Dec. 1, 1968. He will be honored at a dinner April 30 in the Grand Ballroom of the New York Hilton Hotel.

The retired U.S. Air Force colonel, a longtime friend of Rep. Olin E. "Tiger" Teague, selected Texas A&M because of its free enterprise education program and his interest in doing something for the return of Teague's alma mater. Teague will be asked to attend the dinner as Borman's special guest.

Joel Erenburg of the Fund for Higher Education said the Flame of Truth Award honors individuals who have made outstanding contributions to higher education and to mankind.

Erenburg said a one-third share will range from \$100,000 to \$200,000.

Administrators from Texas A&M will be invited to New York City for several functions associated with the presentation, Erenburg said.

Engineer receives Marathon Oil award

Stephen E. Casmus, a Texas A&M University ocean engineering junior from Seabrook, has been chosen for a Marathon Oil Scholarship.

Casmus' selection by the Ocean Engineering Fellowship Committee was announced by Dr. John B. Herlich, professor and head of the Ocean Engineering Program in the Civil Engineering Department.

The Marathon Oil award is the fall semester. Casmus had a perfect 4.0 grade point average last spring and a 3.5 GPR overall.
