An additional source of money will come from dorm room deposits said Buck Weirus, executive director of the Association of Forms Students. Seniors were sent letters requesting they contribute the dorm room deposits or their property deposit.

The amount needed for a scholarship is \$25,000, said R.M. Loga, head of the Student Financial Aid Office. When this amount has becalled the money will be given to the University and invested.
