SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE

FOR STUDENTS COMPLETING 92 HOURS AT THE END OF THE FALL '78 SEMESTER TO BE ELIGIBLE TO ORDER THE TEXAS A&M SENIOR CLASS RING, AN UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT MUST HAVE AT LEAST NINETY-TWO (92) SEMESTER HOURS, WITH 30 HOURS AT A&M AND BE IN GOOD STANDING. TO ORDER AT MID-SEMESTER USING MID-SEMESTER GRADES TO FULFILL THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS, PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS:

1. LEAVE YOUR NAME, MAJOR AND I. D. NUMBER WITH THE RING CLERK, HEATON BUILDING, PRIOR TO NOVEMBER 1ST IF POSSIBLE, OR AT LEAST ONE WEEK IN ADVANCE OF ORDERING. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
2. BRING MID-SEMESTER GRADE REPORTS ALONG WHEN READY TO ORDER TO VERIFY PASSING HOURS.
3. ANYONE HAVING FAILED TO LEAVE THEIR NAME IN ADVANCE AND FAIL TO BRING THEIR MID-SEMESTER GRADE REPORT ALONG WHEN READY TO ORDER WILL BE ASKED TO RETURN LATER TO ALLOW TIME FOR RECORDS TO BE CHECKED.
4. ALL RINGS MUST BE PAID FOR IN FULL WHEN THE ORDER IS PLACED. SENIOR RING LOANS ARE AVAILABLE THROUGH STUDENT FINANCIAL AID IN THE YMCA BUILDING.
5. MID-SEMESTER ORDERS WILL BE TAKEN ONLY FROM OCTOBER 30TH UNTIL DECEMBER 1ST, 1978.
6. Computer, Christian save town

United Press International BRIDGEVILLE, Calif. — A computer error and a generous San Jose realtor saved this tiny Northern California town from being sold minutes before the auction was to start.

The congregation of the Stonybrook Full Gospel Church in the spring of 1977 bought the town from a family which owned the land, with money pooled from savings and the sale of their homes in the San Francisco Bay area.

The entire congregation moved 220 miles north from Fremont, Calif., to the banks of the Van Duzen River in hopes of providing a rural setting for elderly poor people stranded and isolated in urban ghettos.

But they fell behind in their mortgage payments, and the family that had sold Bridgeville contracted with a land and title company for an auction Nov. 14. The parishioners began packing for a move to other parts, and prayed for a miracle.

It came when the computer in which the bids were to be recorded jammed just before the auction, delaying it until last Tuesday. Then 15 minutes before the auction was to start, Don Houston, 50, owner of Vision Realty in San Jose, came forward with a check for \$83,673 to cover the full balance due on the mortgage.

"He (Maharaj Ji) said only recently at a meeting in Florida that he created the world with his left hand and would destroy it with his right hand," Hand said. "We thought cultism was a fading phenomenon but after seeing the similarities between the two men, it's possible something like what happened in Guyana could come about in the mission."

"I wanted to help," said Houston. "I wanted to do something from the moment I heard of their plight. As a Christian, I had no choice."

Cancer victim's death possibly drug-related

United Press International BALTIMORE — A second cancer patient being treated with the drug thymidine has died, officials at the Baltimore Cancer Research Center said Saturday. A spokesman said the patient, a woman in her mid-30s, died Thursday. A male patient also in his 30s who was being treated with thymidine died Tuesday. Dr. Peter Wiernik, director of the center, said he cannot determine the exact cause of death because the woman's relatives will not permit an autopsy. He said she suffered from the form of cancer known as Hodgkin's disease, and also had a fungus infection. Wiernik, who said before the tests began last month that the drug could either be a miracle or a failure, said the male patient had a cancer known as melanoma. Thymidine has been approved by the Food and Drug Administration for limited research trials. Only Baltimore center and the St. Foundation for Cancer in Houston have used the drug on humans. Wiernik said tissue from the victim will be examined this week. Researchers can determine if the drug had any effect on the cells. Three of the seven remaining patients at the Baltimore center completed the first series of five intravenous thymidine doses. The other four are beginning their cycle, Wiernik said. The patients are removed from the drug for five days between cycles so researchers can mark and test for any toxicity. Wiernik said an evaluation of new drug will be conducted after the patients complete the three cycles. The treatments began in October.

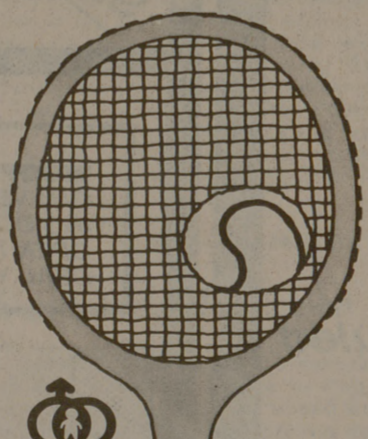
