FOR STUDENTS COMPLETING 92 HOURS AT THE END OF THE FALL '78 SEMESTER TO BE ELIGIBLE TO ORDER THE TEXAS A&M SENIOR CLASS RING, AN UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT MUST HAVE AT LEAST NINETY-TWO (92) SEMESTER HOURS, WITH 30 HOURS AT A&M AND BE IN GOOD STANDING TO ORDER AT MID-SEMESTER USING MID-SEMESTER GRADES TO FULFILL THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS. PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS:  
1. LEAVE YOUR NAME, MAJOR AND I. D. NUMBER WITH THE RING CLERK, HEATON BUILDING, PRIOR TO NOVEMBER 1ST IF POSSIBLE, OR AT LEAST ONE WEEK IN ADVANCE OF ORDERING. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.  
2. BRING MID-SEMESTER GRADE REPORTS ALONG WHEN READY TO ORDER TO VERIFY PASSING HOURS.  
3. ANYONE HAVING FAILED TO LEAVE THEIR NAME IN ADVANCE AND FAIL TO BRING THEIR MID-SEMESTER GRADE REPORT ALONG WHEN READY TO ORDER WILL BE ASKED TO RETURN LATER TO ALLOW TIME FOR RECORDS TO BE CHECKED.  
4. ALL RINGS MUST BE PAID FOR IN FULL WHEN THE ORDER IS PLACED. SENIOR RING LOANS ARE AVAILABLE THROUGH STUDENT FINANCIAL AID IN THE YMCA BUILDING.  
5. MID-SEMESTER ORDERS WILL BE TAKEN ONLY FROM OCTOBER 30TH UNTIL DECEMBER 1ST, 1978.

## Prices double since 1967

WASHINGTON — The government's closely watched Consumer Price Index promised a double dose of discouraging news Tuesday for inflation-burdened Americans.  
The monthly inflation report was expected to show that prices climbed sharply again in October. But it also put the inflation problem in perspective over a longer time frame.  
The Labor Department's index that measures prices consumers pay at retail outlets broke the 200 level for the first time.  
That means goods and services that cost \$100 in 1967 — the base year mandated by the government for such calculations — will have doubled in price over the past 11 years.  
President Carter and the government's top inflation fighters have cautioned the public against searching for any slowing of inflation in the immediate months ahead.  
Carter's anti-inflation program — voluntary wage-price standards coupled with tight federal government restraint — needs time to work, they say.  
Public opinion surveys have demonstrated the public is willing to give the administration that time because it believes something must be done to arrest the alarming erosion of spending power.  
Judging from the wholesale price report made public earlier this month, October consumer costs probably rose at about the same level they have over the course of the year — an annual rate of 9.5 percent.  
Wholesale prices in October soared at an annual rate of nearly 11 percent with more than half of the gain coming from the food and the sectors. Wholesale prices generally are passed along to consumers quickly, especially in the food sector.  
As he has in virtually every speech he has made recently, Carter Monday spelled out the consequences of unchecked inflation on the economic health of the country to a St. Louis address to the National League of Cities.  
"We must control inflation," Carter said. "We must bring it down. We must stop it from interfering with our lives, our aspirations, our future. If we fail to control inflation, we face a deeply troubled future."

## Kansas City still possible GOP host

Josephine Good said Monday in cities, including Kansas City, were still in the running for the convention and that a decision would not be made until a delegation from the party had visited all of the sites.  
Good denied reports that the list of possible sites had been narrowed to Dallas, Minneapolis and Detroit because they were located in states that had elected Republican governors and had ratified the Equal Rights Amendment.
