

### B-CS Christmas parade route revised

Children's Christmas parade will brighten the streets of College Station Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. The annual parade, sponsored by the Commercial Division of the Bryan-College Station Chamber of Commerce, is expecting about 60 entries.

## Davis prosecutors finish with videotaped evidence

HOUSTON — Prosecutors expect today to complete their four-week presentation of evidence in which T. Cullen Davis was heard discussing murder victims and payoffs with an FBI informant.

Jack Strickland and Telly Wilson, prosecutors trying the millionaire on murder solicitation charges, maintain their evidence won't be weakened by Davis' defense team.

"Sure the defense attorneys are going to call a lot of witnesses, but not one of them was present at either the meetings at which the gun, the money, and the photographs of the purportedly dead were changed hands," Strickland said.

"I don't think there's any question that the high point in our evidence is the tapes," Wilson said. The tapes were repeated 15 times for the jury as Davis, weary of the succession of sights and sounds, stared at a notepad or whispered to his lawyers.

"That videotape is like any other observation," Strickland said, "Every time the jury sees it they notice a little bit more."

Informant David McCrory testified Davis gave him \$25,000 in an envelope from the trunk of Davis' car when they met in a Fort Worth parking lot Aug. 20. In the videotapes the men stand with their backs to the hidden camera making it difficult to see what McCrory removes from the trunk.

But the soundtrack of the transaction made by a microphone under

McCrory's shirt indicates a crinkling of paper. McCrory gave 250 hundred-dollar bills to the FBI when he drove away from the meeting. Defense lawyers claim there is a brief period after the meeting when no law enforcement officer had McCrory under surveillance and he therefore could have been given the money by an accomplice.

Strickland said it was unlikely any conspiracy to entrap Davis could have depended upon someone slipping

money to a man who knew he was being watched.

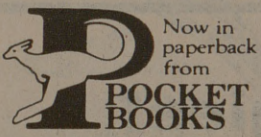
Lending credence to the prosecution case, testimony of an executive secretary from Davis' corporation said Davis telephoned her at home about an hour before his arrest asking for the combination to the office safe. Another secretary testified she placed a thick envelope in the safe for Davis but discovered it was missing after his arrest.

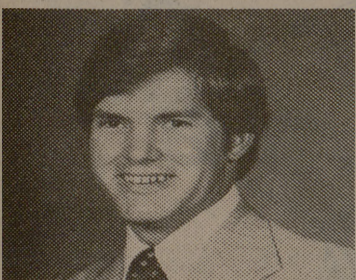

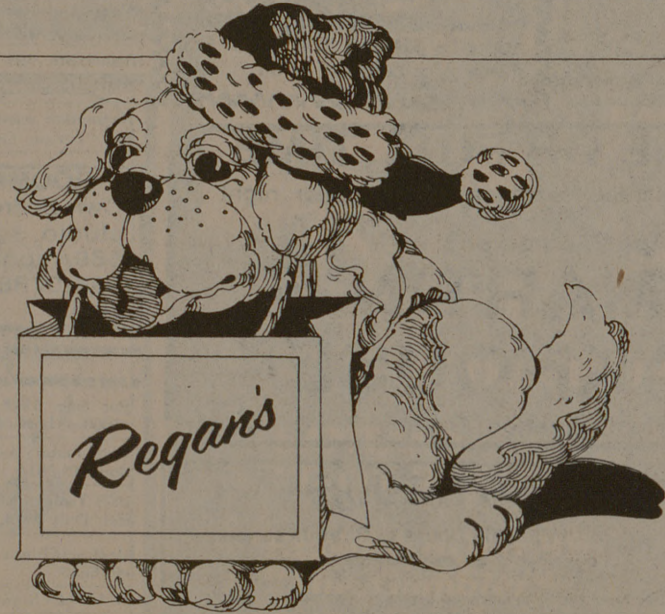
