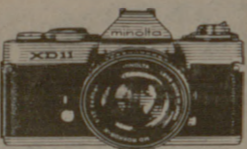

## IRS tax proposal hits racial bias

WASHINGTON — The Internal Revenue Service wants to deny tax exemptions for schools that practice racial discrimination. Such a move would discourage private contributions, an important source of income for those schools.

But "the biggest reaction anyone here can remember" by conservative, religious and educational groups is trying to block the effort. The IRS spokesman who called the reaction the biggest ever said the agency has received more than 100,000 protest letters and expected a large number of critics to show up today when the proposal was scheduled for public hearings.

Schools with stated policies of racial discrimination are subject to taxes already, but the IRS now is aiming at schools that discriminate without advertising it.

Under the proposed regulations, the IRS would presume a private school is discriminatory if it opened — or expanded — during a period of local school desegregation. The provision is aimed at schools that were opened to avoid integration plans imposed on local public schools.

If 20 percent of the school's students were found to be from the local school-age minority popula-

tion, the tax status would be lost. But if the school failed that test, it would have to pass through other ways — such as scholarships, recruitment of minority teachers — that purposely barring minority students.

Critics of the IRS plan to oppose discrimination, but the IRS is overstepping its authority. "The potential consequences of this are frightening," said Robert Billings, chairman of the National Christian Action Council, "you can tax private religious schools, why not tax churches?"

Robert Lamborn of the American Private Education for the IRS proposal "sets up a punitive action and quota system for private schools."

The issue is of vital importance to many private schools that depend on tax-free gifts or other incomes. For many schools, income covers over one-third of their operating costs.

There have been signs of willingness to re-draft the regulations to at least some of the objections.

But IRS chief counsel Seigel defended the agency's objective. "Our role is to create, public policy," he said.
