Although there are few parking places on the main campus now, he outlook for day students and male dormitory residents is even LIVERY rse. Tom Parsons, director of security and traffic, said that last on the east side of Kyle Field, 146 day student and 82 male dorm dent parking spaces were fenced off for construction. In lot 62 next Wofford Cain Pool, 226 day student spaces were fenced. A barracks building was moved to lot 8, taking 98 parking places.

Many of these spaces will not be restored, he said.

ttalion The Kyle Field expansion will permanently take up some of the rking places in lots 48 and 62, and day students and male dorm sidents will lose even more places when new women's dormitories completed, he said.

"It is the University's policy to provide close-in parking for girls," arsons said. He estimated that 400 spaces in lots 9 and 31 behind aw Hall will be reserved for residents of the new women's dorms.






