WASHINGTON - American officials have described what they say is a worldwide Soviet KGB "disinformation" campaign designed to damage U.S. relations with its allies in Europe and the Far East with a forged document.

The KGB circulated a "Top Se-cret" U.S. Army document purport-ing to have been issued March 19, 1970, by Gen. William Westmoreland, then Army chief of staff, concerning "stability operations" in

United Press International CHEYENNE, Wyo. — The Wyoming Senate, the first legislative body in the United States to grant women the right to vote and hold office, Wednesday narrowly affirmed state's ratification of the Equal

The Senate voted 16-13 against a resolution that would have re-tracted the Wyoming Legislature's 1973 approval of the controversial amendment to forbid discrimination based on sex.

In 1977, a similar attempt was rejected by a two-vote margin by the Senate. Senate President L.V. Stafford, a Republican, argued for rescission of ratification. 
