

WASHINGTON — Sen. Alan

Cranston, D-Calif., charged today "hundreds of thousands of dollars in government child support" may have gone to place foster children under the care of cult leader Jim Jones, and that at least one, and maybe 150 of them, died at his Guyana horror camp.


