Senate ok bill to alter parking

The Texas A&M University student senate Wednesday recommended that the method of campus male parking be changed to more closely approximate a true class privilege system.
Under the recommendation, freshmen and sophomores would be designated "underclassmen," and would be required to park across the railroad tracks on the West Campus. Junior, senior, and graduate students would be classified as "upperclassmen." They would receive parking spaces in lots closer to dormitories.
Currently, sophomores are included in the "upperclass" designation, and only freshmen are required to park across the tracks. The bill would change only the designations for male dormitory campus students.
The bill will be forwarded to University administrators for approval. Sponsor Brian Cross said he expected implementation of the bill since the University Traffic Fund approved a virtually identical recommendation.
Bob Price, off-campus undergraduate senator, said that upperclassmen should receive priority in parking space assignments, but added that the increasing scarcity of on-campus parking spaces was a more pressing reason for the bill's adoption.
Construction on Kyle Field has taken away many parking spaces for day students and on-campus males.
Jim Barolak, freshman senator, spoke against the bill "for obvious reasons," he said.
The parking bill was the measure voted on Wednesday.
Senators also heard several bills on first reading. The bills will be voted on at the next meeting.
Among the new bills are measures which would:
— Change the method of designating honor students. The top percent within each classification at each college would be placed on the "President's Honor Roll." The second 5 percent would be placed on the "Dean's Honor Roll."
— Currently, students with a 3.25 better grade point ratio and more than 14 hours receive Distinguished Student designation.
— Significantly increase student representation on several University committees.
— Express senate disapproval of a proposed increase in on-campus parking ticket fines from \$5 to \$10.
— Commend former Chancellor Jack K. Williams for his "leadership and outstanding efforts for the University."
— Recommend that graduate assistants be given the option of participating in the Teacher Retirement System.
