

Executive says EPA too strict

Federal environmental agencies must moderate clean air and water standards to a more "realistic" level, says Robert Herring, chief executive and chairman of Houston Natural Gas Corp.

Herring spoke Monday as part of the College of Business Administration's Visiting Executive Speaker series.

He said the push for clean air has come during a time when Americans cannot afford it. Using Illinois as an example, he said if all Environmental Protection Agency rules were enforced, more than 90 percent of that state's energy generating plants would close.

Despite the fact that his corporation is one of the leading natural gas producers, Herring said the nation's energy future depends on a strengthening use and supply of coal. That will not occur until EPA standards take a realistic economic view of the energy industry, he added.

"All the costs going into meeting environmental standards go into the product and that additional cost is paid for by the consumer," Herring said.

"I have nothing against these standards for new construction, but to say we have to go all the way back and update all the old generating plants up to today's standards is a serious mistake," he said.

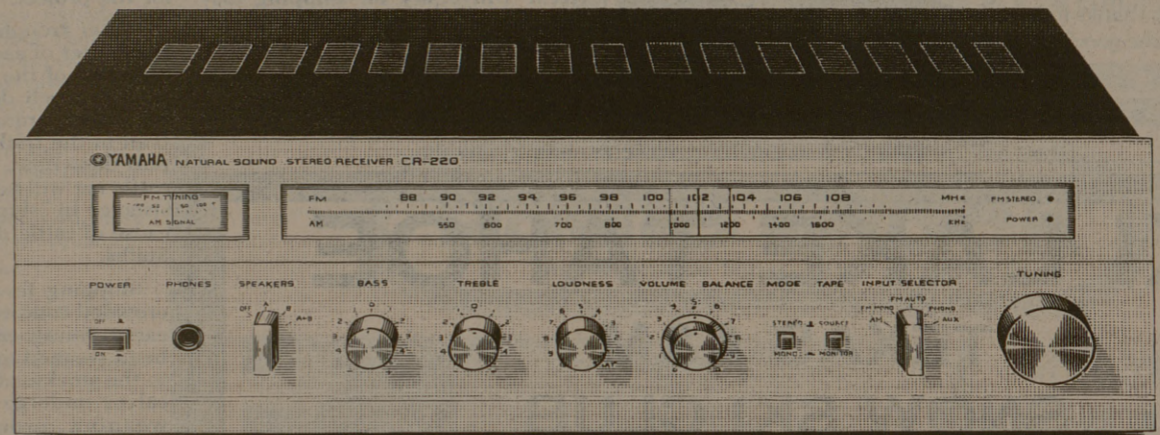

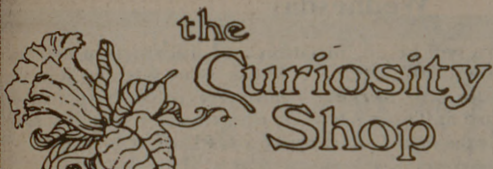
