

Jalapeno Festival

For any of you going home to Laredo this weekend, or just heading that way, the First Annual Jalapeno Street Festival will be held there Saturday. The festival, which will take place in San Agustin Plaza, will feature a Miss Jalapeno '79 beauty contest, a "no-holds-barred" jalapeno-eating contest, an international waiters race, live music, food and drinks.

The beauty contest is open to all interested girls 17 or over. The jalapeno-eating contest is open to anyone over 18 who wants to enter, but the contestant must first fill out a liability release form. The Jalapeno Street Festival is part of Laredo's annual Washington's Birthday Celebration, which also features a Colonial pageant, Colonial ball, international parade, horse racing, Mexican rodeo, fireworks and two carnivals.


