### SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE FOR STUDENTS COMPLETING 92 HOURS AT THE END OF THE SPRING '79 SEMESTER

To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the university. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:

1. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from March 20th until April 27, 1979.
2. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the ring clerk, Heaton Building, prior to March 20th if possible, or at least one week in advance of ordering. This may not be done by phone.
3. Bring mid-semester grade reports along when ready to order to verify passing hours for the spring semester only.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report along when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior ring loans are available through Student Financial Aid in the YMCA building.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted. There will be only a 1-2 week difference in delivery time for those students ordering after final grades are posted during May. (Whenever 92 hours have been completed and are on record, there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send orders to the factory.)
7. The ring clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day, Monday through Friday. However in order for other duties to be carried out, no orders will be taken between 11:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on March 20th or April 27th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately July 18, 1979.

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# U.S. drivers speed between 55 and 65

WASHINGTON — More than half of the nation's motorists exceed the 55 mph speed limit on clear roadways, but few of them are driving more than 65 mph, the Federal Highway Administration reports.  
As a result of motorists' heavy feet, more than 8 million speeding tickets were issued nationwide for the fiscal year ending Oct. 1.  
The information from state highway officials is reported annually under the 55 mph national speed limit law. The speeds are monitored only on flat stretches of roads posted for 55 mph under good conditions and do not include rush hour traffic jams or hazardous roadways.  
Five states had more than 70 percent of monitored traffic going over

the speed limit. They were Kansas, 72 percent; Missouri, 71; Texas, 77; Vermont, 73, and Wyoming, 74. Virginia had only 30 percent of its monitored traffic exceeding 55 mph.  
California issued the most speeding tickets of any state — more than 1 million citations.  
The data indicate that only a small percentage of traffic — 10 percent in most states and a high of 18 percent in Texas — exceeds 65 mph.  
Starting this year, states failing to report that 30 percent of their highway traffic is moving within the 55 mph or less could lose up to 5 percent of certain federal highway funds. In 1983, 70 percent of reported traffic must be in compliance with the speed limit or states could lose 10 percent of those funds.

States refusing to pass and enforce the 55 mph limit face a cutoff of millions of dollars in federal highway aid. Several western and southwestern states recently introduced bills easing the speed limit and challenging the federal standard.  
Sen. S.I. Hayakawa, R-Calif., and others also have introduced national legislation to relax the speed limit law but no bill is considered likely to be passed.  
The Transportation Department estimates the lower speed limit has saved 18,000 lives to date and 1 billion gallons of gas a year.  
But highway officials believe that the 1978 highway death toll exceeding 50,000. The rise above the 55,000 mark was the first since the 55 mph limit was imposed in 1974 following the Arab oil embargo.
