U.S. drivers speed between 55 and 65 States refusing to pass enforce the 55 mph limit for cutoff of millions of dollars in fer

WASHINGTON - More than half of the nation's motorists exceed the 55 mph speed limit on clear roadways, but few of them are drivng more than 65 mph, the Federal

As a result of motorists' heavy eet, more than 8 million speeding tickets were issued nationwide for the fiscal year ending Oct. 1.

Highway Administration reports.

The information from state highway officials is reported annually under the 55 mph national speed limit law. The speeds are monitored only on flat stretches of roads posted for 55 mph under good conditions and do not include rush hour traffic ams or hazardous roadways.
