"I'm very pleased to report that ome progress has been made," fedral mediator Ansel Garrett said Monday night after police and city egotiators met for 6½ hours in the rst bargaining session since more han 1,000 officers left their posts Friday night

Despite the progress, Mayor Er-nest Morial canceled another owntown Mardi Gras parade that was to roll through the streets tohight and said it was be "realistic" to accept the fact the raucous pre-Lenten carnival festival could be wrecked by the strike.

Hotels reported an increase in telephone calls from concerned Mardi Gras guests, but no wholesale cancellation of reservations was involved. Carnival visitors continued to stream into the city and crowd French Quarter streets, but Bourbon Street businesses reported a 30 percent drop in sales this year comared to last year's pre-carnival ac-

They loaded the van and disappeared

The planning that apparently went into the heist led authorities to believe it was an inside job, and 150 Lufthansa employees were given lie-detector tests.
