SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE FOR STUDENTS COMPLETING 92 HOURS AT THE END OF THE SPRING '79 SEMESTER

To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the university. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:

1. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from March 20th until April 27, 1979.
2. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the ring clerk, Heaton Building, prior to March 20th if possible, or at least one week in advance of ordering. This may not be done by phone.
3. Bring mid-semester grade reports along when ready to order to verify passing hours for the spring semester only.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report along when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior ring loans are available through Student Financial Aid in the YMCA building.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted. There will be only a 1-2 week difference in delivery time for those students ordering after final grades are posted during May. (Whenever 92 hours have been completed and are on record, there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send orders to the factory.)
7. The ring clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, no orders will be taken between 11:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on March 20th or April 27th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately July 18, 1979.

Limits on trade names may increase prices

WASHINGTON — Higher prices for consumers may result from a Supreme Court ruling that allows states to restrict the use of trade names.

The high court Wednesday upheld a 1969 Texas law that prohibits optometrists from using any name other than the one on their state license to practice. About 20 states have similar laws.

A Federal Trade Commission spokesman said the ruling gives states a green light "to prevent

people from mass merchandising under trade names."

This would inhibit companies such as Sears, Roebuck and Co. from entering the health care market, the spokesman said, restricting consumer choice and sending prices up.

In other actions, the court: —Agreed to review the government's controversial health standards for worker exposure to the suspected carcinogen, benzene.

—Promised to consider New York City's plea that the government wrongly denied \$3.5 million in special education aid.

—Denied an appeal by television reporter Joe Pennington of a 60-day jail sentence for refusing to identify a "source" in a Kansas murder case.

Another result of the court's decision to uphold the banning of trade

names is likely to be an attack on legal clinics.

Michael Hutter, an Albany, N.Y. law professor who has studied the Texas case, noted that "there is nothing that would prevent this rule from being extended to other professions."

Court observers said the decision departed from earlier rulings which the high court overturned advertising bans on lawyers or pharmacists holding that it is a form of commercial speech protected by the First Amendment.

In Wednesday's decision, the majority said trade names are "significantly different" from commercial speech, largely because they can be used to mislead the public.

"This decision is a partial concession to the kind of paternalism the court rejected in the lawyer and pharmacy advertising cases," said Bill Canby, Arizona State University law professor.

"Before, the court said let the consumer decide. But it seems to be backing away from that now," he said.

The Texas law was challenged by N. Jay Rogers, an optometrist who said the state law inhibited his freedom to practice under the name "Texas State Optical."

In delivering the majority opinion, Justice Lewis Powell said the trade name "conveys no information about the price and nature of services offered by an optometrist," he said, and quality information can be manipulated, leading to a "significant possibility trade names will be used to mislead the public."

Using a trade name, "free an optometrist from dependence on his personal reputation to attract clients, and even allows him to assume a new trade name if negligence or misconduct casts a shadow over the old one," Powell wrote.

Justices Harry Blackmun and Thurgood Marshall dissented, saying the court's decision "overstates the potential for deception and underestimates the harmful impact of the broad sweep" of the Texas law.

Charges coming in 6 states

EL PASO — An immense investigation into organized crime in six states could produce swift and numerous indictments by a grand jury that has interviewed a host of witnesses, including two who shielded their identities by wearing hoods from the public, a U.S. attorney reports.

Three states — Florida, New Mexico and Arizona — were added Wednesday to the list of states involved in the widening investigation of alleged interstate racketeering, gambling, prostitution and drug trafficking.

Government investigators from Texas, Nevada and Washington already are involved in the case.

"There are three federal grand juries alone in the Western Judicial District of Texas involved in elements of this investigation," U.S. Attorney Jamie Boyd said Wednesday.

After two mysterious black-shrouded figures appeared before the 23-member federal grand jury, Boyd declined to detail any specifics of testimony that linked the other states to the investigation. However, one official said privately, "We've got what we need now."

The early stages of the investigation are almost completed," Boyd said, "and we can expect more indictments to come reasonably soon from this grand jury."

He said Texas federal grand juries in El Paso, Midland and San Antonio were involved in related investigations which were touched off by the Nov. 21 assassination attempt on Assistant U.S. Attorney James Kerr at San Antonio, and the Dec. 23 slaying of Lee Chagra at his El Paso office.

There has been speculation investigators from the FBI, Drug Enforcement Administration and Internal Revenue Service may have gained leads on organized crime activities while poring over records in Chagra's law office.

Local police locked everyone but law officers out of the office for five days after the killing, reportedly to the chagrin of clients represented by the attorney, known locally as "F. Lee Chagra," who defended notorious gambling and narcotics defendants.

Boyd indicated witnesses from the other states may be included in up to 200 persons to be subpoenaed by the local grand jury. One source said "about 40" witnesses from Las Vegas may be called to testify.

Chagra's brothers Jimmie, a Las Vegas gambler, and Joe, an El Paso attorney, have appeared before the secret panel as have several of the slain attorney's friends.

Kerr, 38, former head of a narcotics task force in the Western District of Texas who has built a long record of convictions, was ambushed near his home in San Antonio by two men who fired 19 bullets into the hood and fender of his automobile. Kerr escaped with minor glass cuts and has been assisting with the investigation.

Libyans raising oil price tag

BEIRUT, Lebanon — Libya raised the price of its oil 5 percent because of the chaotic supply situation on world oil markets caused by the crisis in Iran, oil industry sources said Thursday.

Algeria, Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, Qatar and Iraq have announced plans to increase prices.

The sources said the 5 percent hike on Libya's light, high-quality crude was effective Wednesday. Further details were not immediately available.

"They informed their customers this is the case, so in that sense they have announced it, but they don't usually announce it publicly," the industry sources said.

The move was not unexpected since other countries have taken similar action. The Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries scheduled a special "consultative" session in Geneva March 26 to discuss the crisis of supply on the world markets.

Algeria says it will raise its prices for the second quarter of the year and the authoritative, New York-based Petroleum Intelligence Weekly says a 15-to-20 percent barrel premium can be expected.

Iraq told its customers to be Baghdad within two weeks to negotiate contract prices.

Abu Dhabi and Qatar have stepped 7 percent premiums on their light crudes. Saudi Arabia is charging year-end prices for oil products over its 8.5 million barrel-a-day production ceiling.

The Abu Dhabi and Qatar have worked out to about \$1 a barrel in the Middle East economic summit called this "a relatively modest increment considering that the spot market premium has soared around \$7 or \$8."
