Former U.S. Rep Eilberg pleads associates with the ancient Druids, to conduct rites "to pray for the healing of the earth and the people on it"

PHILADELPHIA — Former Pennsylvania congressman Jos Eilberg Saturday pleaded guilty to charges he illegally accep money for helping his former law firm obtain a \$14.5 million led grant for a Philadelphia hospital.

After Special Assistant U.S. Attorney Alan M. Lieberman of the details of the change of plea for the Philadelphia Democrat berg quietly told a federal judge that he had agreed to the ple U.S. District Court Judge Raymond Broderick reserved ruli

whether he would accept the plea.
"I'm not bound as a judge by the terms of that agreement and court at this time is reserving the right to accept or reject that agree ment," Broderick said.

Under terms of the agreement, Eilberg will be sentenced period of probation to be determined by the court, if it accepts plea, and fined up to \$10,000 but not less than \$5,000.

Eilberg, 58, had been charged with violating a federal confinerest statute which prohibits members of Congress from reco compensation for advocating private causes before federal agen which the government has an interest.

Eilberg had been accused of drawing thousands of dollars from account of a law firm as his share of a fee the firm received for h Hahnemann Medical College and Hospital of Philadelphia obta grant from the Community Services Administration, an anti-po

He was indicted last Oct. 24, about two weeks before he u cessfully sought a seventh term as representative for Pennsyl 4th Congressional District, which includes northeast Philadel At the time of the indictment, Eilberg denied the charge claimed it was timed to hurt his re-election chances.

Eilberg gained national attention in January 1978 when it was closed that he had telephoned President Carter and asked his "expedite" the dismissal of former U.S. Attorney David W. Man a Republican.

It was learned at the time that Marston, appointed by Pre Gerald Ford, had been investigating the roles allegedly pla Eilberg and fellow Pennsylvania congressman Daniel Flood
