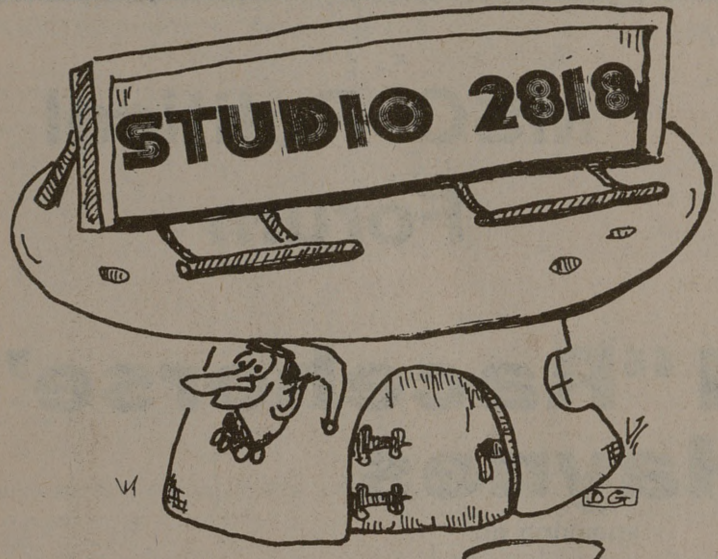

Aggies accept NIT invitation

Texas A&M and Texas Tech have been invited to participate in the 24-team National Invitation Tournament, while Texas has accepted a bid to the NCAA play-offs. This marks the first time the SWC has had four teams participating in post-season tournament play. The Aggies will play the tough

New Mexico Lobos in Albuquerque Thursday night.
"This will be a good experience for us," Aggie coach Shelby Metcalf said Sunday night. "I'm not real sure what kind of team New Mexico has. I think they're a high scoring outfit. I would think they probably play a press-and-run style. They're a good team because they've been in

the play-offs two years in a row now. They went to the NCAA tournament last year and they're going to the NIT this year."

Is the NIT invitation a fitting reward for the Aggies, who will go into the tournament with a 22-8 season record?

"I think that's the way you'd have to look at it," Metcalf said. "I haven't talked to the players yet. But my thinking is that as long as we're doing something with that ball, it's going to help us further down the line. I think it will be a good experience."

In order to get to the semifinal competition in New York's Madison Square Garden, the Aggies would probably have to win three road games. With spring break next week, it is doubtful that a game will be played in G. Rollie White Coliseum.

"I'm excited; I'm looking forward to it," junior Dave Goff said.

"Everybody (on the team) was pretty letdown this weekend, losing the way we did and missing out on the NCAA."

"But this will give us a chance to show what we can do and I think as the week goes on we'll get more and more excited."

Texas Tech will host the University of Indiana.

"It's a great thrill to be invited," said Tech coach Gerald Myers. "I'm very happy for our players, especially our older guys, like Geoff Huston, who have worked so hard."

Texas and Oklahoma will meet in Dallas next Saturday in basketball — on the opening weekend of the NCAA tournament.

NCAA officials made up the schedule Sunday and created the possibility of yet another Texas-Oklahoma meeting in the Midwest regional finals. But to get there the Longhorns will have some tough playing to do. If Texas defeats Oklahoma, the Longhorns will likely have to play the top-rated Indiana State in the regional semifinals at Cincinnati on March 15.

Arkansas, meanwhile, opened Sunday in Lawrence, Kan., as the winner of Friday night's Big Sky championship. The State and Missouri Valley conference runner-up New Mexico State defeated Weber State in the opening round of last year's NCAA tourney.

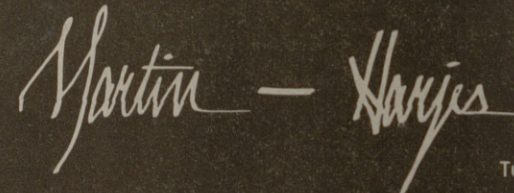

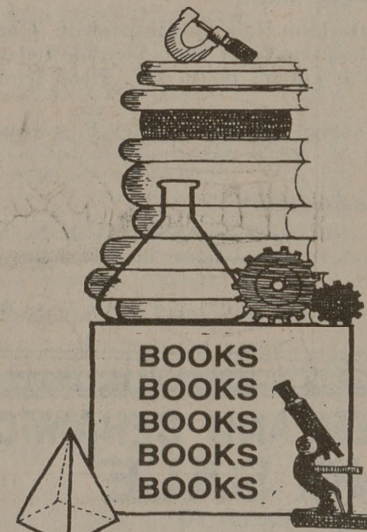
