Paul McCartney

Paul McCartney and Wings will be featured in a 90-minute special, "Wings Over the World," which is a collection of footage from the group's world tour of 1976 plus a profile of McCartney's career since the Beatles broke up in 1970. The program will air March 16 on CBS, and provides films of the tour that have never been publicly shown. Except for news coverage at the time, no films of the tour have been released.

As one of the two chief songwriters and personalities within the Beatles, McCartney has held an important place in the lives of literally millions of his followers, both during his years with the group and after their breakup. Unlike other members of the group, or any of the Beatles' musical colleagues, he has remained an entertainment figure with appeal to all ages.

In 1976, audiences crowded auditoriums all over the world to spend an evening with Paul McCartney and Wings. The 10 years that had passed since his last American stage appearance increased fan anticipation. Among the selections performed in the concert footage are "Band on the Run," "Yesterday," "Live and Let Die," "Jet" and "Silly Love Songs."

Wings' success has been recorded in a number of gold and platinum albums, and their 1977 release, "Mull of Kintyre," is now the all-time bestselling single in Britain.
