

# Voters decide adoption of CSA April 7

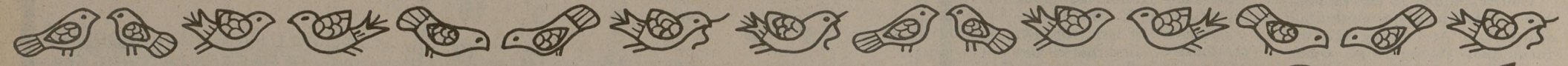

 would be an autonomous body whose decisions could not be overruled by the city council.  
 The council feels that a commission of this type could not be sensitive to employees because it would not be familiar with their problems.  
 "I think we should not unload responsibility because that's what have been elected to do," Mayor Smith said. "Also, the commission wouldn't have an working knowledge of activities within the city and couldn't be as sensitive."  
 The Committee for Public Safety countered with a section from the

Civil Service statute that requires the commission to "inspect all institutions, departments, offices, places, positions and employments affected by the act at least once every year."  
 Wentreck said this section alone would make the commission much more sensitive and familiar with problems of city employees that the city council seems to be at present.  
 The Civil Service Act would allow employees to collect up to 15 days of sick leave a year with pay. The accumulation of sick leave would be unlimited and employees leaving the department would receive a

lump sum payment for up to 90 days of accumulated sick leave.  
 The present city policy allows employees with less than 15 years of service to collect up to 10 working days of paid sick leave or 15 days of paid sick leave with 15 years of service. The days may be accumulated up to 120 days and payment of the collected sick leave is not authorized for any type of employee termination.  
 The council feels that employees would use the sick leave policy unfairly and stated in their resolution that it "can be a detriment to the city in that it encourages people to

leave thereby increasing problems of retention of experienced employees."  
 Evans said he had not contacted any other cities that have adopted the act to determine how the city budget would be affected by paying accumulated sick leave.  
 The Committee for Public Safety said an employee could not under the act collect the full benefits of the 90 day sick pay unless he worked with the department for six years at a rate of 15 accumulated days per year.  
 The committee concluded that it

would be unfeasible for an employee to quit just to collect his sick pay when it would take him six years to gain the maximum amount.  
 Finally, the city council personnel policies apply to all city employees, the passage of the Police and Firemen's Civil Service Act, the council feels, would cause unequal treatment for the other city employees not covered by the Act.  
 The Civil Service Act was added to the April 7 ballot after a petition was submitted to the council Jan. 22 with enough names for the issue to be added to the ballot.

**SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE FOR STUDENTS COMPLETING 92 HOURS AT THE END OF THE SPRING '79 SEMESTER**

To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the university. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:

1. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from March 20th until April 27, 1979.
2. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the ring clerk, Heaton Building, prior to March 20th if possible, or at least one week in advance of ordering. This may not be done by phone.
3. Bring mid-semester grade reports along when ready to order to verify passing hours for the spring semester only.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report along when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior ring orders are available through Student Financial Aid in the YMCA building.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted. There will be only a 1-2 week difference in delivery time for those students ordering after final grades are posted during May. (Whenever 92 hours have been completed and are on record, there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send orders to the factory.)
7. The ring clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day, Monday through Friday. However in order for other duties to be carried out, no orders will be taken between 11:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on March 20th or April 27th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately July 15, 1979.
