WASHINGTON — Big city families cope with inflation mainly by cutting their food bills, according to a four-city survey by the Center for the Study of Metropolitan Problems. The center reported the second most used tactic was extra work, either overtime or, less often, moonlighting or sending an additional member of the family out to work. The findings were reported by the American Council of Life Insurance, in Washington. The cities in the study were New York, Detroit, Atlanta and San Francisco.
